Gladiolus Bulblets

Bulblets are the small, hard shelled small bulbs that grow between the old bulb and the new one and come true to whatever the variety is. The bulblets of some varieties are slow to germinate; while others come quickly. Some have large ones and some no larger than a grain of wheat. Some bulblets of early varieties will bloom the first year with good care, while others take two to three years. On an average you cannot expect more than a 50% or ½ germination, so do not anticipate too much from bulblets.

We cannot all afford to pay \$5 00, \$10 00, \$25.00 or even \$1 00 for a new and promising variety of Glads. but one might spare 10c or perhaps \$1 00 for a bulblet, that with proper care might give you a small bloom the first year and a nice bulb for next season. By peeling the bulblet and planting it in a small pot or dirt band in March or April and get it well started by the time the garden is ready to plant, then turn out of pot or remove the dirt band without disturbing the roots and planting in the ground, they give splendid results.

Directions for Growing Bulblets

Make a trench three or four inches wide and two inches deep (if soil is light and sandy, three inches). Sow the bulblets in the bottom as you would peas. They can be quite close together, a half inch apart each way. Now put in one inch of dirt and pack down thoroughly with hoe or with your feet. Then fill up the

trench with the rest of the dirt, but leave it loose. They must be kept quite damp and not allowed to dry out. You can lay old gunny sacks over the rows, and when green shoots begin to come through take them off. Keep ground well stirred and all weeds down, and you should have a nice lot of bulbs in the fall. If the bulblets are soaked in water for three or four days it makes them come better and quicker.
