ROOTS—All orders will be filled with strong divisions of field grown roots, AS SOON after April 1st, as seems advisable, unless otherwise specified.

GUARANTEE—We guarantee every root sent out by us to be true to name, also to be in growing condition when received, after which our responsibility ceases, as we have no control over growing conditions. Please notify at once if anything is unsatisfactory when received. Any root that fails to grow within three weeks after being planted we will replace upon return of the old root. While we exercise the greatest care to have our stock true to name, should any prove otherwise, we will cheerfully replace; but it is mutually agreed between the purchaser and ourselves that we shall not at any time be held responsible for a greater amount than the original price of the stock.

TERMS—Cash with order, money order or cash by registered mail. Roots will be shipped by parcel-post prepaid. All C. O. D. orders must be accompanied with 25% of the order, C. O. D. charges to be paid by the customer.
