Davis White Kidney Wax—52 Day
The long, straight pods, flat and stringy. A good shipper. Color bright yellow—seed white.

Pencil Pod Black Wax—52 Day
The best of the black seeded wax beans. Very productive. The pods are round, large, about 7 inches long, entirely stringless and of excellent quality. More disease resistant than most other sorts.

New Stringless Kidney Wax—53 Day
Considered one of the best. Pods about 6 inches long, straight, fleshy, stringless. Color and attractive clear yellow.

Improved Golden Wax—45 Day
Plants are small, compact, erect, and very prolific. Pods are borne well off the ground, which prevents rust and rot, are of golden yellow color, brittle, fleshy and solid with waxlike texture.

Wardwell's Kidney Wax—53 days

Red Valentine—52 Days

One of the most dependably productive for home and market garden. Pods medium green; $4\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 inches long.

Burger's Green Pod Stringless

(Kentucky Wonder White Seeded) 63 days. The finest quality of any of the pole beans.

TABLE VARIETIES

Crosby's Egyptian (Original Strain)

50—55 days. Splendid home and market garden sort. Tops medium in size; collar small. Root flattened globe-shape, with small tap root; very dark purplish-red.

Detroit Dark Red—52-55 Days.

The standard of excellence in table beets for home and market garden, shipping and for canning. Tops uniform, small, slender, erect. Roots globe-shaped; very dark blood-red.

Early Wonder—50-55 Days:

Very desirable for home and market garden. Tops small. Root flattened globe-shape with small collar and tap root. Flesh deep-purplish red zoned a lighter shade.

Edmand's Early Blood Turnip

60 days. For home and market garden. Tops medium small but coarse. Roots deep turnip-shaped, almost globular; very dark red. Flesh deep purplish-red zoned with a lighter shade.

Extra Early Egyptian Blood Turnip

50 days. Best for forcing and particularly valuable for early market. Tops small and upright; roots flattened, with long slender tap roots; flesh dark purplish-red zoned lighter.

Early Eclipse—55 Days.

For home and market garden. Tops small, erect, slender. Roots globe-shaped; dark purplish-red.

SWISS CHARD



Only the tops of this beet are used, like spinach, and the succulent stalks and midribs may be prepared in the same way as asparagus. The plants are cultivated like beets except that they should be thinned to 8 or 10 inches apart. If only the outer leaves

are gathered, the inner leaves will continue to grow, and repeated pickings can be made.

Large Ribbed White (Silver Leaf)

The leaves are broad, somewhat waved but smooth, and of a medium light yellowish-green. The stalks are broad and flattened, but tender and succulent.

STOCK FEEDING

Golden Tankard

Yellowish orange; not so long as Giant Long Red. Flesh yellow zoned with white. Grows well out of ground and may be harvested without plowing loose.

Giant Long Red

Attains very large size; shape as shown above. Good crops yield 30 to 50 tons per acre. Roots grow more than half above the ground. Color light red, flesh white and rose pink.

CABBAGE SEED OF HIGHEST QUALITY

Our seeds are both imported and Long Island, (N. Y.), grown, and especially grown for the market gardener and general home.

1.—St. Louis Late Market

The plant is very vigorous and hardy, the leaves are large and broad, the stem of moderate length, the head large, white, solid and seldom bursts.

2.—Stein's Early Dwarf Flat Dutch

90 days. A variety, well suited for market garden culture, and being a good shipper is used very extensively by the produce growers.

3.—Giant Flat Dutch

4.—All Seasons

85 days, if planted in spring; about 80 days when planted in July. Leaves and head are of fine clear green color. Head thick and broad.

5.—Danish Round Head

Heads round, solid and of excellent quality. Stems very short. The plant is vigorous and compact. Leaves few but rather large, thick and smooth.

6.—Surehead—110 Days

Similar to Late Flat Dutch. Rather long in stem, the head of average size, compact and regular.

7.—All Head Early

8.—Enkhuizen Glory

This large, early white, solid sort is of excellent quality and particularly attractive for market. Very few outside leaves. About ten days later than the first early sorts. A sure header and a heavy yielder.

10.—Copenhagen Market—80 Days

Very early, round headed, exceptionally large, solid and of very fine quality.

11.—Early Winningstadt—80 Days

Heads are much more pointed and usually smaller than the round and flat headed varieties, but they are solid, tender and of fine quality.

12.—Jersey Wakefield

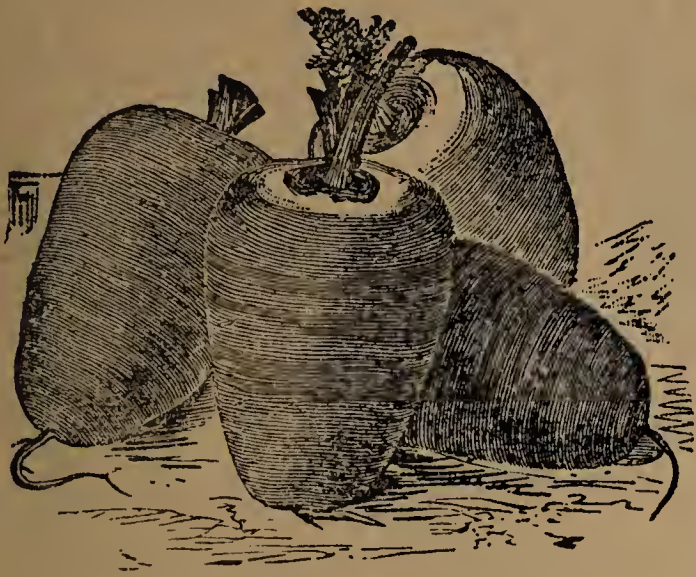

An excellent early sort. Roots about six inches long, smooth, deep orange color.

Nantes Coreless

This variety is used very extensively Half-long, early, 6 to 7 inches long, holding the same thickness to the tap root, where it tapers abruptly to a small tap root. Roots smooth, tender, bright orange. An excellent sort for home garden or market.

Danvers Half Long

A half-long orange carrot. The best known second early. Roots 6 to 8 inches long. Very productive and suited to almost any soil. Tender and of good quality.

60 days. Splendid pickling and slicing sort. Fruits medium dark green.

Chicago Pickling (Westerfield)

60 days. Valuable pickling and slicing variety.

Early Cluster

56 days. Very fine for early slicers.

Evergreen White Spine (Arlington)

66 days. Splendid for home garden, market garden and shipping.

Improved Long Green

Crimson Giant

The hom gardener who desires a radish or more than two bites will find this to his liking. The crimson roots are the largest of the early round radishes. They do not become fully grown until nearly 2 inches in diameter, but are very good while much smaller. The flesh is as crisp and mild as any of the smaller varieties, and they remain in perfect condition for several days.

Cincinnati Market

Popular home and market garden radish. Tops short and small. Roots 6 to 7 in. long.

Icicle

Clear white roots which grow to a length of 6 inches with a third of their length out of the ground and are delicately tinted with ivory at the tops.

Half Long

Roots are about 3 inches long when full grown, about $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch in diameter, and long-oval in shape.

Sparkler

Similar to early Scarlet Turnip, White Tipped but with more pronounced white area. Tops small. Roots deep turnip, almost globe-shape; bright scarlet with pronounced white tip.

White Strasburg

Good summer radish for home and market garden. Roots commonly become 5 inches long, $1\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 inches in diameter at the shoulder; tapered, smooth! white; flesh firm, crisp.

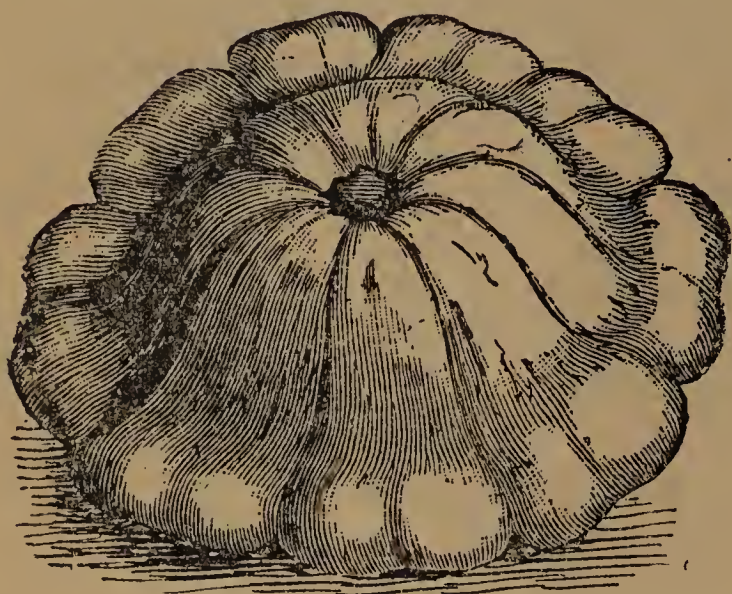
