DESCRIPTION OF THE WHITE HALE

The White Hale is an open pollinated seedling of J. H. Hale. It is a large, round, firm-fleshed, white peach ripening at about the same season as the J. H. Hale. The tree is more vigorous and free in growth than J. H. Hale. The flowers are of the medium type and self-fertile in contrast to its self-sterile seed parent. It develops more red skin color than Belle, the pubescence is shorter and it has superior shipping qualities. The edible quality is equal to or somewhat better than Elberta. It should be a better white peach than Belle to sell on a roadside stand with J. H. Hale because of its larger size, firmer flesh and more attractive color. The new variety tends to meet the demand for a white peach to follow Belle. It appears to be of about the same hardiness as J. H. Hale and Elberta and to succeed best upon well elevated sandy to sandy loam soils.
