





ASPARAGUS

Culture:—Asparagus seed may be sown directly in the permanent bed and the plants thinned as they grow; or it may be sown elsewhere, and the seedlings transplanted the second year. An ounce of seed will sow 60 feet of drill, and produce about 300 plants. Fair crops may be expected the third year

CONOVER'S COLOSSAL. Widely cultivated; very large, deep green; tender stalks of good flavor; the roots are vigorous and productive. Pkt., 5c; Oz., 25c; ¼ lb., 75c.

BEANS—BUSH Green Podded

Culture. Plant in light, warm soil in the spring when danger from frost is past, in drills from 2 to 3 feet apart, covering about 2 inches deep. Sow every two weeks for succession. Cultivate frequently until they blossom, but only when dry.

Two pounds will plant 100 feet of drill.





BEETS

One ounce to fifty feet of drill, six pounds to the acre.

The best results are obtained on a deep, rich, sandy loam. For early use sow as soon as the ground will admit, in drills fourteen inches apart, and thin to four inches. For the main crop sow the first week in May, and for winter use as late as June. The soil should be deeply manured and well cultivated. In lifting and storing the roots care must be taken that they are not bruised.


Cultivated for the small heads that grow from the main stem; these small heads are firm and compact like little cabbages, and are considered a great delicacy by many people. Cultivate the same as cabbage or cauliflower.

CABBAGE

One ounce will produce about 3000 plants; four or five ounces per acre.

The Cabbage is one of the most important vegetables, and some of its varieties universally cultivated. The ground must be highly manured, deeply dug or plowed, and thoroughly worked, to insure good, full-sized heads; a heavy, moist and fresh loam is the most suitable. The early sorts should be sown very early in the spring, in hotbeds, or later in the open ground. Eighteen inches by three feet apart is the common distance.



CARROTS

One ounce to 100 feet of drill; 3 to 4 pounds to the acre.

Carrots require a finely pulverized soil to grow them to perfection. A good, light, and well enriched sandy loam is the best for this crop. For field culture, sow in drills three to three and one-half feet apart so as to cultivate by horse. Market gardeners sow in drills about eighteen inches apart, and cultivate by hand. For early crops cover one-half an inch deep, and thin to four inches apart, in the rows; for late, cover three-fourths of an inch deep, and thin to four inches.

CAULIFLOWER

Any soil that will grow cabbages will grow cauliflower, as their requirements are almost similar, but as the product is more valuable, extra manuring and preparation of the soil will be well repaid. The seeds may be sown in the hotbed in March or April, and transplanted to open ground about the first of May.

One ounce will produce about 2,500 plants.

CELERY

One ounce of seed produces about 4000 plants.

To have celery early it should be sown in a hotbed quite early in the spring, and when three inches high plant out in a well-prepared bed, which must be covered in frosty weather. For the principal crop, sow early in the spring, very shallow in the seedbed, and when the plants are about six inches high transplant them about six inches apart into trenches, for blanching. Dig the trenches four feet apart, a foot wide and ten inches deep. Fill in five or six inches of well-rotted manure and mix thoroughly, half a spade deep, with the earth at the bottom. The tops of the plants should be shortened before they are set. Earth up

to blanch, three or four times during their growth, taking care that no earth falls in the center of the plants.

BOSTON MARKET. A favorite variety, remarkable for its tender, crisp, succulent stems; keeps well. Pkt., 5c; $\frac{1}{2}$ Oz., 30c; Oz., 50c.

CORN—Sweet

One pound to 125 hills, 18 pounds to an acre.

The Sweet or Sugar varieties, being liable to rot in cold or wet ground, should not be planted before the middle of May and for a succession continue planting every two weeks, until July, in rich, well-manured ground, in hills three feet apart each way, covering about half an inch and thin out to three plants to a hill, or plant in rows four feet apart, and to stand eight inches apart in rows. The field varieties should be planted four feet apart each way, leaving three plants to a hill.






Peas for an early crop should be sown as soon as the ground is in working condition. The soil for their reception should be light, dry, and well sheltered. Mild manure, such as leaf mould, has a beneficial effect; but for many of the varieties, the soil cannot be too rich. For general crop the ground should be well manured the previous year, which causes them to yield more abundantly. When grown as a market crop, peas are never staked, and are sown in single rows two or three inches deep, and from two to three feet apart, according to the variety or strength of the soil. When grown in small quantities for private use, they are generally sown in double rows, six or eight inches apart, and the tall varieties staked up by brush or poultry netting. If the poultry netting is taken up as soon as the peas are picked it will last many years.



FLOWER SEEDS

For best results, flowering plants should be grown in a rich, sandy loam. Do not cover too deeply. A general rule is to cover from $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, but for the very fine seeds, the best results are obtained by merely pressing them into the earth, and sprinkling them lightly with loose earth to prevent seed drying up. In dry weather, they should be sprinkled frequently.

Sow as early as the ground can be prepared in a rich, moist soil, in drills 6 inches deep, covering about 2 inches. As the vines grow, fill up the trenches with soil and thin out to about 4 inches apart. A good plan is to sow in double rows with a trellis between.

When plenty of manure is available, dig trench 12 to 15 inches deep. Lay 4-inch land tile in the bottom of trench. Stop up one end with cement. Place an elbow on the other end and add tile enough to come a little above surface of soil. Lay small pieces of tarred paper over the joints to keep out dirt until soil has firmly settled. Fill trench with the manure until when well treaded, it is 4 inches from the surface. Water freely with hose. Fill nearly to the top with loam, sow the seed and cover about 2 inches. When plants have grown 3 or 4 inches high, thin to 4 inches apart and fill around them as they settle in the trench. Water freely in the tile twice a week. Dissolve Nitrate of Soda in the water occasionally for best results.
