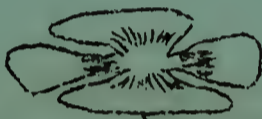

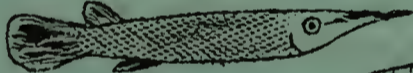

SHIPMENTS -

All shipments go forward in rotation as they come in, we reserving the right to either ship by Express or Parcel-post, whichever may be the safest at that time. By doing this, we are looking out for your interest. On parcel-post orders of less than \$1.25, please include 15¢ for parcel-post charge.

TERMS -

Orders go forward only when sufficient funds to cover are accompanied with order. Shipments made C. O. D. (either by Express or Parcel-post), will go forward only when at least 25% of the total is sent with order to guarantee acceptance of same.

SHIPPING CANS -

Our Shipping Department is endeavoring at all times to deliver to you live healthy specimens and use their best judgment as to how many fish will ship safely in a can or thermos.

REPLACEMENTS -

We replace fish and plants only when accompanied by a bad order slip from the Railway Express Agency. Please examine same on arrival and should there be a loss, kindly get bad order slip. We will replace your fish or plants and put in claim from this end.

We do our best to answer all questions, but for fuller instructions on fish and plants, you will find the following books full of Aquatic information. Stoye, an American Aquarium book that surpasses the German books on the market. Also, Life and Love in the Aquarium by C. H. Peters. All 3 of these are the Newest out and the best on the hobby. You may also buy all three from Wm. T. Innes & Sons or The Home Aquarium Bulletin, East Orange, N. J. For the identification of New Tropical fish, we suggest the Bilderatlas, which is a picture book with Latin name below each fish and may be bought from August M. Roth, World Building, Baltimore, Maryland.

IMPORTANT!

On arrival of shipments of fish, do not transfer them immediately into your water, as there may be a strong chemical difference between the two waters and the sudden change would be a shock to the fish, causing many ills. Siphon the water from the can into the aquarium, put the fish into the aquarium and add a little of your tempered water in proportions of about a gallon to five gallons of our water per day. A slow change of this type is beneficial to the fish and you will have no losses.



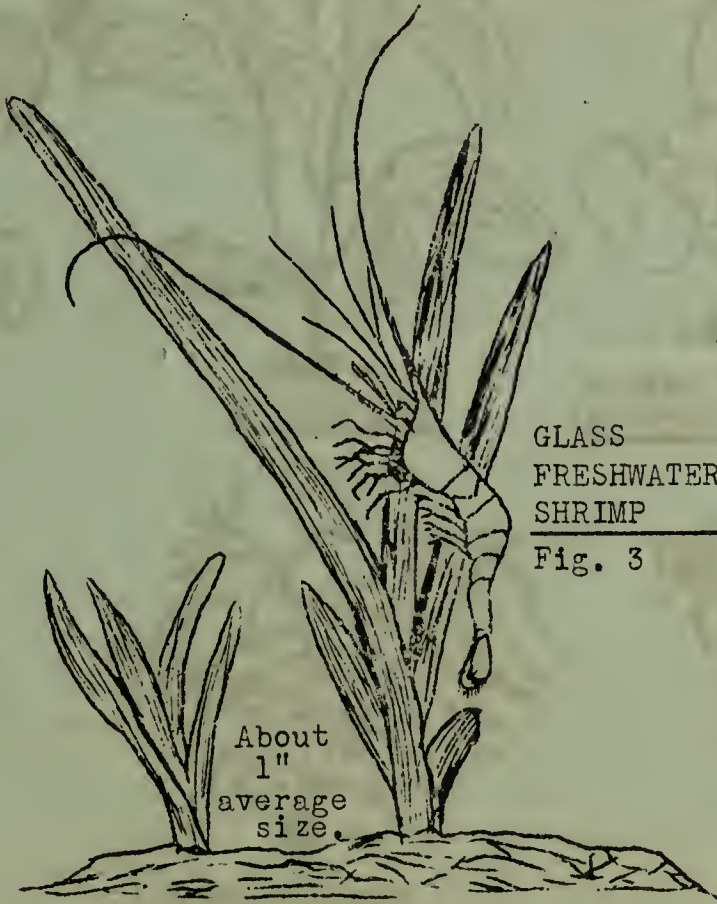

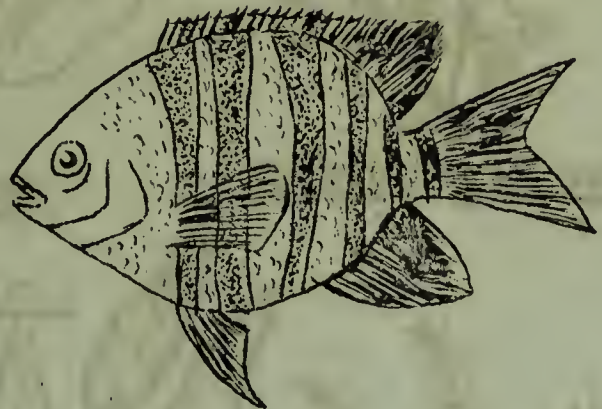

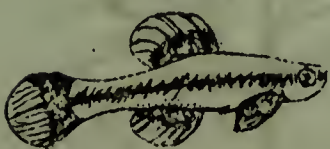

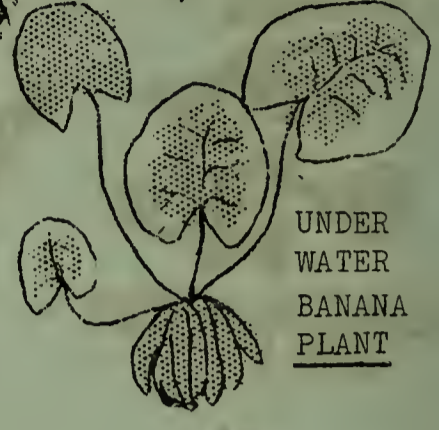
