#### About Ordering, Shipping, Etc.

Orders may be sent at any time and goods will be shipped at the time specified on the order. Freight shipments are now handled by the railroads much more promptly than formerly and we advise having all heavy shipments (100 lbs. or more) sent in that way.

#### Terms and Discounts

To gardeners of established credit and those who furnish us with satisfactory references we allow the following time payments except on field and grass seed, which are strictly cash with order.

Bills for seeds, plants, etc., shipped after January 1st are due and payable net August 1st.

Bills for goods shipped after August 1st are due net December 1st.
