When planting in a rock garden, use some of the tall growing varieties for background, such as the **American** and **Pyramid Arbor Vitae**, **Austrian** and **Scotch Pine**, **Norway Spruce** and **Canadian Hemlock**.

The **Junipers** and **Arbor Vitae**s can be trimmed to prevent spreading or growing too tall.

PERENNIALS IN BLOOM

Don't forget to visit the nursery during the month of June when thousands of perennials are in bloom, and in July and August when many varieties of **Hardy Phlox** are in bloom. A good display will be on hand each day from which to select.

ANNUALS IN BLOOM

Many annuals are in bloom at the nursery during the summer months. If your garden is not complete, you can get **Petunias**, **Verbenas**, **Bachelor's Buttons**, **Pinks**, **Marigolds**, **Lobelias**, **Snapdragons**, **Zinnias**, etc., all in bloom, just what you need to fill up that vacant space in the garden.

The nursery is open every day all summer. The summer planting of flowers is increasing each year. The plants should be planted in late afternoon or evening for best results. Water the ground before planting and again afterwards. Press earth firmly around roots.

Perennials should be protected in winter with a covering of three or four inches of straw. Cover in the fall when the ground starts to freeze.

When planting a shade tree cut back top branches one-half. Dig the hole deep and fill with water which should be allowed to settle. Set tree deep and tamp hard with foot. After tree is planted water again. Then water about twice a week for a month if in sandy soil. Less watering is required in heavy soil. Some varieties of trees will drown if watered too much.

BLACK DIRT

Our black dirt is nearly all humus. Humus is decayed vegetation and decayed vegetation is nature's fertilizer. It produces a good growth of new vegetation wherever used, in flower pots, window boxes, flower beds, gardens or lawns.
