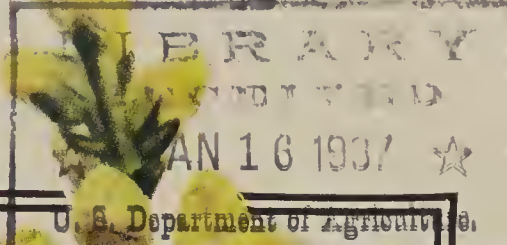

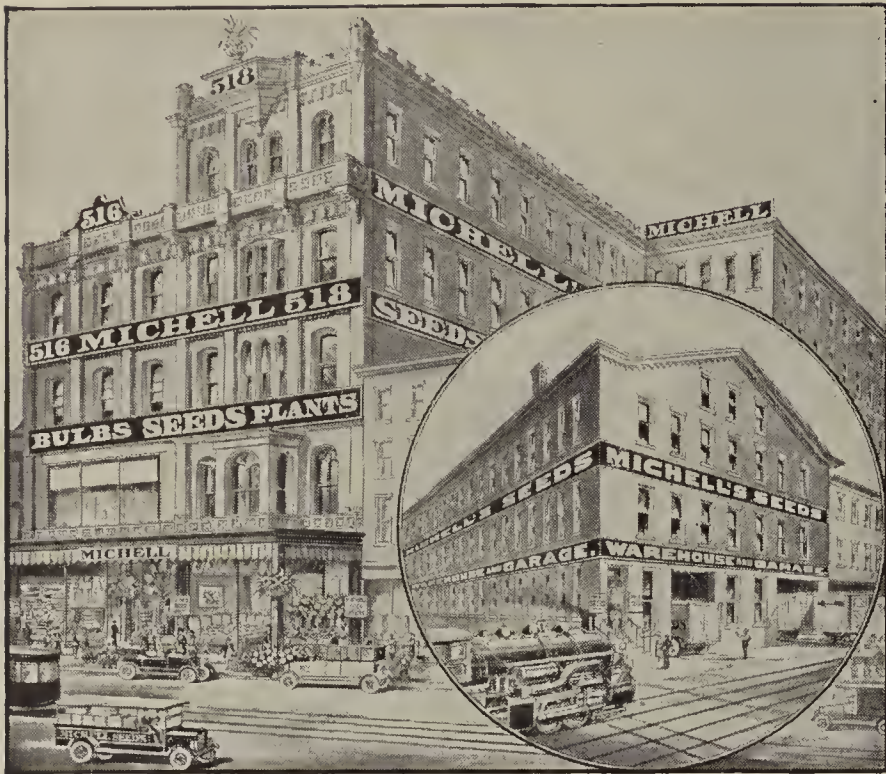

### Discounts

On bills for Flower Seeds, Vegetable Seeds, and Bulbs, a discount of 2 per cent for payment 10 days from date of bill may be deducted; 5 per cent cash discount is allowed on all orders of Flower Seeds and 3 per cent cash discount on all orders of Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs when remittance accompanies the order, unless on items specially quoted or priced. Cash discount above does not apply to dealers' orders, unless so stated in quotations or otherwise. All other goods are strictly net, as are also bills for goods supplied under special quotations unless otherwise agreed upon.

### Conditions of Sales

All contracts, sales, and acknowledgments of orders are contingent upon crop failure, our ability to import and make deliveries in conformity with the "Plant Quarantine Act," partial deliveries by growers or manufacturers, strikes, or other unavoidable causes beyond our control, clerical errors included; also unsatisfactory credit standing. All quotations are subject to market changes and goods being unsold on receipt of order.

### Notice to Customers in Canada and other Countries outside of the United States

In remitting for purchases at the time of ordering, or when paying accounts, by reason of the Exchange we ask that you please send Post Office Money Order in United States funds or a check or draft on a New York or Philadelphia Bank in par United States funds.

### Forwarding Service

We pay postage on all orders for Vegetable and Flower Seeds provided the order calls for packets, ounces, quarter pounds, or pounds (beans, corn, peas and grass seeds, bulbs, plants and sundries are not included). If these are wanted by mail, remit for postage the amount named in connection with the item to the first and second zones; for other zones add additional postage. All postage is charged on dealers' orders regardless of items ordered.

### Parcel Post Rates

On Seeds, Bulbs, Plants or Roots not exceeding eight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is 1c. for each two (2) ounces or fraction thereof; on sundries or other merchandise not exceeding eight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is 1½c. for each two (2) ounces or fraction thereof. Seeds, Bulbs, Plants, Roots, Sundries, etc., weighing over eight (8) ounces, are sent at zone rates.

If Special Delivery is wanted, an additional 15c. is required on packages weighing up to two (2) pounds—25c. on packages weighing more than two (2) pounds and up to ten (10) pounds—35c. on packages weighing more than ten (10) pounds, which also includes special handling and transportation as first-class mail.

If remittance accompanies order, a sufficient amount should be included to cover the extra charges—if ordered to be sent by either of the methods as stated above.

We do not make shipments of Plants or Cold-Storage Bulbs C. O. D., and shipments of goods C. O. D. outside of our automobile delivery limits can only be made that way provided a partial remittance is sent with the order to guarantee that the goods will be accepted on arrival.

### Important Notice

All shipments of plants, perishable stock, and cold-storage bulbs are made at buyer's risk only.

If such shipments arrive in bad condition, accept them and receipt for them accordingly, and make claim for your loss on the transportation company. We, of course, will hold ourselves ready to assist you in any possible way. It has been found that claims can be collected more readily by the person receiving the goods than by the shipper.

Our custom to guarantee the actual arrival of goods (except at points where there is no Freight or Express agent) will still be continued, and claims for loss or non-arrival of merchandise not perishable will, as in the past, be cared for by us, so you run no risk of having to make claims for lost goods.

Michell Co. give no warranty, expressed or implied, as to the description, purity or productiveness of any seeds, plants or bulbs they send out, and they cannot be in any way responsible for the crop. If the customer does not accept the goods on these terms, he must notify us at once, and we will give instructions for disposition of goods.

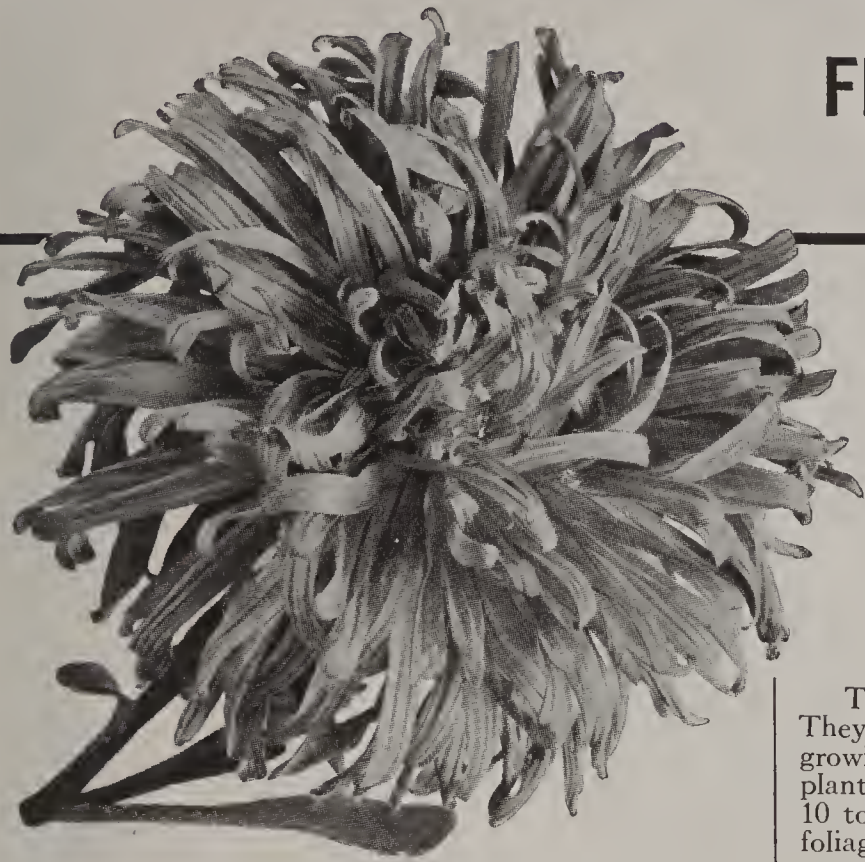

### Aster, El Monte ALL-AMERICA WINNER

A companion to the sensational Aster, Los Angeles. The large deep glowing crimson flowers, borne on heavy, non-lateral, basal-branching stems, are composed of abundant quantities of daintily interlaced, plume-like petals. Very early blooming and floriferous, and the only real large-flowering crimson Aster. No disbudding is necessary, due to its non-lateral habit.

Barnyard manure should never be employed as a fertilizer. We recommend the use of finely ground bonemeal. Asters should not be grown in the same location two years in succession.

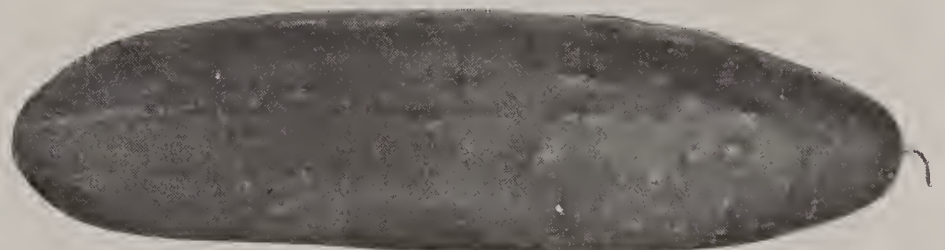

SUGGESTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE GROWING OF HARDY LILIES UNDER GLASS

Hardy Lilies should be grown cool and given 16 to 18 weeks from time of planting to bring them into bloom, so the best results can be obtained; in fact, if you can give them longer to come into flower it is better. Where they are forced with plenty of heat, the result is that you get good foliage with not so many early blooms. We refer particularly to *Magnificum*, *Melpomene*, *Rubrum*, and *Album*.

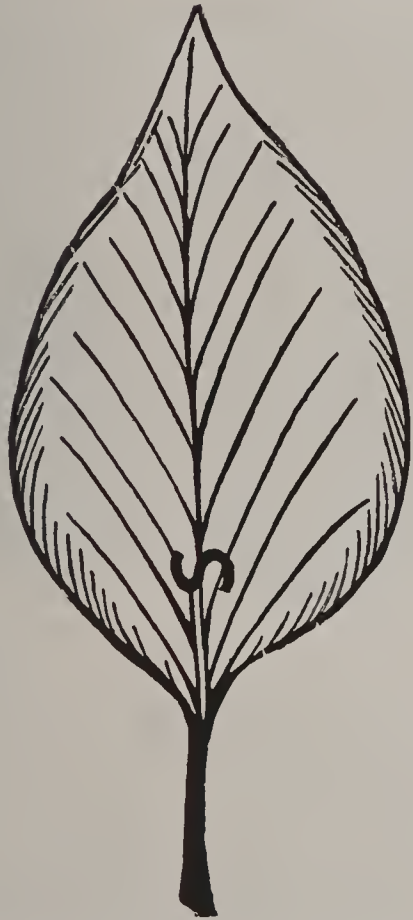


Illustration shows the Philly Pin when on leaf. Notice how flat it lies and the firm hold it takes.

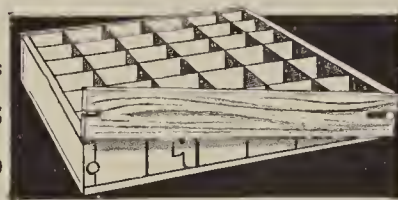

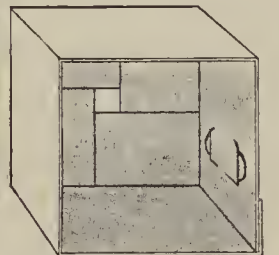
