



#### We Welcome Charge Accounts

We invite you to take advantage of a charge account with us. So that no time will be lost in executing your first order, please refer, preferably, to someone in either your own or our line of business with whom you have a charge account. This frequently saves delay.

#### Discounts

On bills for Flower Seeds, Vegetable Seeds, and Bulbs, a discount of 2 per cent for payment 10 days from date of bill may be deducted; 5 per cent cash discount is allowed on all orders of Flower Seeds and 3 per cent cash discount on all orders of Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs when remittance accompanies the order, unless on items specially quoted or priced. Cash discount above does not apply to dealers' orders, unless so stated in quotations or otherwise. All other goods are strictly net, as are also bills for goods supplied under special quotations unless otherwise agreed upon.

#### Conditions of Sales

All contracts, sales, and acknowledgments of orders are con-All contracts, sales, and acknowledgments of orders are contingent upon crop failure, our ability to import and make deliveries in conformity with the "Plant Quarantine Act," partial deliveries by growers or manufacturers, strikes, or other unavoidable causes beyond our control, clerical errors included; also unsatisfactory credit standing. All quotations are subject to market changes and goods being unsold on receipt of order.

#### Forwarding Service

We pay postage on all orders for Vegetable and Flower Seeds provided the order ealls for packets, ounces, quarter pounds, or pounds (beans, corn, peas and grass seeds, bulbs, plants and sundries are not included). If these are wanted by mail, remit for postage the amount named in connection with the item to the first and second zones; for other zones add additional postage. All postage is charged on dealers' orders regardless of items ordered.

#### Parcel Post Rates

On Seeds, Bulbs, Plants or Roots not exceeding eight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is 1c. for each two (2) ounces or fraction thereof; on sundries or other merchandisc not exceeding eight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is  $1\frac{1}{2}$ c. for each two (2) ounces or fraction thereof. Seeds, Bulbs, Plants, Roots, Sundries, etc., or fraction thereof. Seeds, Bulbs, Plants, Roots, weighing over eight (8) ounces, are sent at zone rates.

If Special Delivery is wanted, an additional 15c. is required on packages weighing up to two (2) pounds—25e. on packages weighing more than two (2) pounds and up to ten (10) pounds—35c. on packages weighing more than ten (10) pounds, which also includes special handling and transportation as first-elass mail.

If remittance accompanies order, a sufficient amount should be included to eover the extra charges—if ordered to be sent by either of the methods as stated above.

We do not make shipments of Plants or Cold-Storage Bulbs O. D., and shipments of goods C. O. D. outside of our automobile delivery limits ean only be made that way provided a partial remittanee is sent with the order to guarantee that the goods will be accepted on arrival.

#### Important Notice

All shipments of plants, perishable stock, and cold-storage bulbs

are made at buyer's risk only.

If such shipments arrive in bad condition, accept them and receipt for them accordingly, and make claim for your loss on the transportation company. We, of course, will hold ourselves ready to assist you in any possible way. It has been found that claims can be collected more readily by the person receiving the goods than by



Hardy Lilies should be grown cool and given 16 to 18 weeks from time of planting to bring them into bloom, so the best results can be obtained; in fact, if you can give them longer to come into flower it is better. Where they are forced with plenty of heat, the result is that you get good foliage with not so many early blooms. We refer particularly to Magnificum, Melpomene, Rubrum, and Album.





Illustration shows the Philly Pin when on leaf. Notice how flat it lies and the firm hold it takes.


