


The Phlox is one of the most satisfactory of all the perennials for the border as well as group planting by itself. For landscape effect there is nothing that surpasses them on account of their dependability and long blooming season. They bloom from early July until September or until frost cuts them down. Owing to the many brilliant colors, the demand for Phlox is increasing every year. For best results plant two feet apart in rich loamy soil and open sunlight. Divide and transplant every third year. We suggest you make your selections early.




