THE world's finest evergreen shrub for Pacific Coast Gardens, may also be grown in pots or tubs in colder sections, and sheltered during winter. Will bloom beautifully indoors if kept in a cool room. They will grow in most ordinary garden soil, but prefer an abundance of leaf mould or peat moss. A north or east exposure is preferable and temperatures to 10° above will not harm them unless exposed to the full sun. Pot-grown plants may be set out any time, or may be flowered indoors and set out in the spring. The elegant shaped waxy flowers often unfold very early, and the beauty of them brings a thrill not soon forgotten. They start flowering in the smallest sizes.

For discriminating buyers, desiring the finest pure named specimens, healthy, vigorous plants that will add immeasureably to the beauty of a home or garden, we offer the following selected varieties:

- ROSITA—Finely formed deep rose; symmetrical flower; medium size; very profuse bloomer. From 50c to \$2.50 each.
- YUKI-BOTAN—Very large double imbricated flower, with pure white petals, turning back; late flowering; large roundish leaves; rare and very choice. \$1.50 to \$2.50 each.
- HIKARU GENJI—A large light pink, with beautiful markings of lighter shading on the petals. 75c to \$2.50 each.
- SHISU—Deep scarlet, of symmetrical form; is very late flowering and compact; slow growth; medium large size; a rare beauty seldom seen, but much admired.

- KUMASAKI—Deep rose, of very large size, and elegant form, somewhat irregular; profuse flowering, and of lasting quality. Truly the outstanding sort in this climate. Pot-grown; from 75c to \$2.50 each.
- PINK PERFECTION—Very formal light pink; of medium size, but great beauty; from 4-inch pots; 50c to \$1.00 each.
- MAGNOLIAEFLORA—Flowers magnolia shaped; of a transparent pale pink; semi-double, with masses of yellow anthers in center; from 4-inch pots. \$1.00 each.

- CHANDLERII ELEGANS—A very large flowering sort; of bright rose pink color in the saucer-like petals, with anemone formed center of petalloids of a lighter shade, producing a unique effect. Perhaps the most admired Camellia today, for its large size and unique form; 4inch pot-grown, \$1.00.
- PURITY—Symmetrically formed; pure white; of good size; very double; 4-inch pot-grown—75c.
- AREJISHI—Finely formed scarlet; of extra early flowering habit, with stems of bronzy color; shiny leaves. \$1.00 to \$2.00.
- WAKANURA VARIEGATA—A very large flowering sort, with semi-double and single flowers, often on the same branch; color, bright red, with blotches of white, irregularly placed, some times pure red only. The large size and its changing colors make this a most interesting and showy sort, but of slow growth. Pot-grown, \$1.00 to \$1.50.
- CAPRICE—Pure white double, with golden stamens; \$1.00 each; pot grown.
