## Zinnia Linearis

The most unusual and interesting of the newer Zinnias is the little dwarf variety, Linearis. The flowers, which are single, are a lovely shade of golden orange, with a delicate lemon yellow stripe through each petal, while the center is dark brown in the young flowers, turning golden orange as the pollen develops. It is extremely early blooming, commencing to flower when the plants are about 6 inches tall and keeping on right through the season until the late frosts of autumn. It never looks untidy, as the dozens of newly opened flowers prevent the faded ones from becoming prominent. The plants reach a height of 8 to 10 inches and with plenty of room for development may have a spread as much as 2 feet by the end of the season. The flowers are produced in great profusion, literally hundreds being open at a time. Linearis is an extremely valuable addition to the list of plants suitable for border or edging use and is excellent for window boxes or in any part of the garden where a dwart growing plant with brilliant coloring is desired. It will start flowering about 6 weeks after seed is sown.
