

HARROLD'S PEDIGREED NOVELTIES: This mixture is made up from individual plant selections in our breeding department. It contains some of the finest specimens obtainable in the Pansy world today. Nearly every color and form that is most desirable is represented in this mixture.

Recommended where the unusual is desired.

HARROLD'S PEDIGREED POT PANSIES: A short growing giant type, which, if grown properly in a cool, well ventilated house, will make fine individual specimen plants for pot or box setting.

HARROLD'S PEDIGREED CUT-FLOWER PANSIES: A fine giant sort which, grown under similar conditions to those above, produces many fine flowers on stems 6 to 11 inches long. Wide color range.

HARROLD'S RUBY GIANTS: The finest selection of giant red Pansies we know of. Ranging from the red bronzes and orange scarlet, to brilliant deep mahogany. These are very desirable.

HARROLD'S AZURE GIANTS: A brilliant blue companion to the above variety. Giant size and very early, producing quantities of large sized flowers on long stems.

HARROLD'S GOLDEN GIANTS: A golden yellow companion to the above two varieties. Large flowers produced in profusion makes this sort desirable, and the distinctive dark center blotch adds much to its attraction.



Eighty percent are Harrold's Pedigreed Strain varieties, while the other twenty percent is composed of seeds from specimen plants in our trial grounds; where tests of other principal varieties and strains are periodically grown for comparison. This mixture is unsurpassed among the standard mixtures for the variation of types and colors contained

HARROLD'S IMPROVED SWISS: A Harrold bred strain of this popular variety that is outstanding in size and coloring, as well as being much earlier than any other strain of the Swiss family with which we have compared it to date. In spite of the many "Improved Swiss" and "Super-Swiss" strains obtainable, we predict that you will not appreciate this variety until you have given this strain a trial. Compact habit.

HARROLD'S GREATER AMERICAN PERFECTION: A modest priced giant variety, introduced by us right after moving our growing operations to the west coast. Similar to the Harrold's Pedigreed Giants in type, although not so highly developed. Highly recommended however, where a small compromise in strain quality can be made to obtain a lower price on seeds.

HARROLD'S OREGON MIRACLE MIXED: This is the lowest priced of the genuine Harrold bred varieties. With large sized flowers and its wide color range, it is a sound value. It may successfully be used as a competitor of any other sort at near its price range; being superior to most of the stock in this price range. Do not, however, make the mistake of economizing through the use of this variety in a market that more modern stock can be sold in.

# OUR 1937 NOVELTY HARROLD'S Pedigreed Swiss Giants

This is our principle 1937 Novelty which will be of interest to all Pansy growers, commercial as well as fanciers. As its name implies the stock is of the fancy type and has been bred from "Swiss" parents.

The chief drawback of the "Swiss" strains in the past has been the late flowering habits and a weakness of plant habit. These we believe we have substantially improved even over our old and tried standby in this class—our Harrold's Improved Swiss offered on page 4.

Flower color range is also somewhat advanced through additions of several exclusive new ones as well as widening the color range in the better known shades, has resulted in a more attractive coloring and the five blotched center is more prevalent than in most stock. Plant habit is compact and less inclined to leg out while the blooming period with us is but a few days later than our Harrold's Pedigreed Giants which are noted for their early flowering habits. Brightened colors has also added to the value of this sort as a subject for mass bedding, a feature of many "Swiss" strains which is entirely lacking because of dead and dark colors.

In size the flowers excell anything we have seen in this class to date and substance is somewhat improved although they are still not as heavy in substance as some of the Exhibition types. Size, of course, like with all Pansies, is dependent upon environment and culture. With us this has been excellent, ranging up to better than  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches.


# HARROLD'S PEDIGREED Pansy - Seeds

In southern districts there is still time to plant Pansies outdoors while the grower located in the north can plant in heated beds with good results up to the first of the year; or in flats from January first to late February to obtain plants suitable for spring sales. Indoor sown stock that is transplanted into frames as soon as the severe weather is past will make good stock for sale from mid-April on.

# Art - Shades

Resulting from more than a third of a century of specialized Pansy experience, this variety has been bred from our HARROLD'S PEDIGREED GIANTS, and like its parent it has a compact very robust plant habit. The flower size, while possibly little larger than the parent stock at its maximum, is more consistent and we believe the average will be found quite a bit better. Flower form, of course, meets the Harrold strict standard. Flowers are symetrical and of excellent substance, holding their graceful shape without floppiness.

It is in the coloring of this strain, however, where the greatest departture has been made; and it is because of this coloring that we have used the decriptive name for this variety. Many of the colors are so unusual to Pansies that we have ourselves never seen many of them until this stock was developed. Markings run strongly to novelty types, giving many unusual combinations. The colors runs quite bit to the light and pastel shades although a balancing of darker shades makes the mixture very attractive Whites are rare but a new absolutely pure yellow, without markings is included in this mixture along with a substantial number of other yellows. This makes an especially arresting color mixture for counter and basket as well as garden sale. You'll certainly want some of these this year.

# HARROLD'S NEW Double Petunia Oregon Beauty

This new Double Pink Petunia excells in every way any variety of similar type we have ever grown. It's color a deep glowing true pink, and the extreme large size of the flowers produced in such profusion makes it one of the first subjects noticed by every visitor to our greenhouses.

We have grown this variety now for the past two years and experience with it as a retail item leads us to believe that it has no equal either for pot or bedding. The compact dwarf plant habit lends itself well to pot and box culture, while its symetrical form recommends it highly as a border plant for bedding.

The resemblance of the flower to an extremely large pink Carnation makes an excellent substitute for these in design work, and if flowers are placed in water for two or three hours before being used they not only stand up well but outlast many more commonly used varieties in making up work. While stems are short like all Petunias they are adequate for wiring. Used for made up work they offer the advantage that they may be had in abundance in almost any season, and they make an excellent filler for use when other stock is scarce.

The photographs on this page made from one of our beds just a few days before going to press, gives a more graphic idea of their merit than word will express. We offer strictly our own propogation from a single plant selection, and as quantity will be somewhat limited this first year of disemination orders will be filled in strict rotation as fast as possible. These are recommended to the southern grower and gardener for planting out in open beds, and in localities where weather is severe this stock may be bedded or potted in a cool to cold house, cold frame or protected bed to grow on into stock for the spring market. Shipping of plants of all kinds are often subject to conditions not under direct control of the grower which makes it impossible at times to adhere to our usually well planned schedule. As nearly as possible, however, we maintain 48 hour shipping service excepting that shipment will not be made on this schedule if there is danger of delayed delivery through arrival on Saturday.

Weather affects preparation of outdoor stocks so delays of short duration because of this may occure in the winter months. Usually not for long tho.

If parcel post shipment is desired on any plant or bulb order you should remit adequate postage. Otherwise c. o. d. with resulting added fee will be attached for deficeency or shipment made by Express collect. This rule applys to transportation charges only, and does not abridge our terms of sale covering prices and remittance as setforth elsewhere in this catalogue. We prepay SEEDS ONLY, not plants or bulbs





With our stock obtained only after the bulbs are ready for shipment and after a season of rigid field inspection, we are in a position to select for you the absolute cream of this district's crop. Third: We have no cull bulbs which must be sacrificed because of low quality, neither are we compelled to sluff off varieties that are not of value to the professional grower just because we had the stock and did not feel we could afford to throw it away. Fourth: We can best serve you by suppyling a premium quality bulb even at a slight premium in price as by so doing you are in turn enabled to produce a premium product.

#### TERMS OF SALE

All Gladiolus offered herein are quoted net, except as noted, on a basis of cash with order; or 50 percent cash with order, balance c.o.d. Prices are all made for shipment and delivery being made f. o. b. the offices of the transportation agency at Grants Pass, Oregon. Shipment in every case, unless specifically ordered otherwise, will be by Express collect. Shipment in this manner may safely be made in the most severe weather. If l. c.l. heater freight service is available at your station, however, delivery by that means may safely be had at a saving of nearly half compared with Express; providing shipment weighs 100 pounds or more. See your local freight agent and make sure this heater services is available to your station before ordering winter shipments that way.

Orders for future delivery are sold as of date of placement, at which time order will be graded and assembled, and stored in our warehouse subject to the shippers instructions. No additional charge will be made for this storage, but aside from using due care exercised in storing the sellers own stock, no responsibility for shrinkage or warehouse spoilage natural to such conditions will be assumed. We suggest that where possible, all shipments be made by March 15th, as shrinkage and spoilage after that date increases here to a noticeable degree due to the earliness of our season.

#### PLEASE NOTE

#### **GRADE SIZES**

Our Gladiolus Grade Size Schedule conforms with that generally in use in this trade, namely: Number one size is 1½ inch and up; Number two, 1¼ to 1½; Number three, 1 to 1¼ and Number four ¾ to 1 inch. Size one and two in the standard grade is commonly used for indoor planting while for outdoor work the smaller sizes often are found most suitable. Remember that unless ordered not to do so should we be out of size ordered next larger or smaller size to same value will be supplied.

#### QUANTITIES AND DISCOUNTS

Items quoted will not be supplied in quantities less than 50 cents per item, or orders for less than \$2.00. Where price is by the hundred 25 of a size and variety may be had at the hundred rate.
