## Points on Gladiolus Forcing

Use good quality well cured bulbs. The No. 1 size gives best results, producing good spikes a few days earlier than smalier sizes. It is seldom profitable to piant before January 15th. Earlier piantings bloom no earlier and come a larger percentage blind.
Plantings made in late January and early February usualiy plower in 110 to 120 days. March 1st plantings of some varieties will fiower in 90 to 100 days. Grow varieties that are recommended for greenhouse cuiture. Not all varleties are good for forcing.

Gladiolus may be pianted in pots, raised benches or ground beds. There should be plenty of depth to the soil if the benches are used. Avoid soll too high in nitrogen. Soil that is good for Carnations is good for Giadiolus. Cover the bulbs with $21 / 2$ inches to 3 inches of soil and keep weil supplied with moisture.
A 50 degree $F$. temperature is best for starting the bulbs. This may run up to 58 or 60 degrees $F$. during sunny days.
