On bills for Flower Seeds, Vegetable Seeds, and Bulbs, a discount of 2 per cent for payment 10 days from date of bill may be dedueted; 5 per eent eash diseount is allowed on aII orders of Flower Seeds and 3 per cent eash discount on all orders of Vegetable Seeds and Bulbs when remittance accompanies the order, unless on items specially quoted or priced. Cash diseount above does not apply to dealers' orders, unless so stated in quotations or otherwise. All other goods are strictly net, as are also bills for goods supplied under special quotations unless otherwise agreed upon.

## Conditions of Sales

All contracts, sales, and acknowledgments of orders are contingent upon crop failure, our ability to import and make deliveries in conformity with the "Plant Quarantine Act," partial deliveries by growers or manufacturers, strikes, or other unavoidable causes beyond our control, clerical errors included; also unsatisfactory eredit standing. All quotations are subject to market changes and goods being unsold on receipt of order.

## Forwarding Service

We pay postage on all orders for Vegetable and Flower Seeds provided the order ealls for packets, ounces, quarter pounds, or pounds (beans, corn, peas and grass seeds, bulbs, plants and sundries are not included). If these are wanted by mail, remit for postage the amount named in conneetion with the item to the first and seeond zones; for other zones add additional postage. AII postage is charged on dealers' orders regardless of items ordered.

## Parcel Post Rates

On Seeds, Bulbs, Plants or Roots not exceeding eight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is 1 c . for each two (2) ounces or fraction thereof; on sundries or other merchandise not exeeeding cight (8) ounces in weight, the postage charge is $11 / 2$ e. for each two (2) ounces or fraction thercof. Seeds, Bulbs, Plants, Roots, Sundries, ete., weighing over eight (8) ounces, are sent at zone rates.

If Speeial Delivery is wanted, an additional 15c. is required on packages weighing up to two (2) pounds- 25 c . on packages weighing more than two (2) pounds and up to ten (10) pounds-35c. on packages weighing more than ten (10) pounds, which also ineludes special handling and transportation as first-elass mail.

If remittance aceompanies order, a sufficient amount should be included to cover the extra eharges-if ordered to be sent by either of the methods as stated above.

We do not make shipments of Plants or Cold-Storage Bulbs C. O. D., and shipments of goods C. O. D. outside of our automobile delivery limits ean only be made that way provided a partial remittance is sent with the order to guarantee that the goods will be accepted on arrival.

## Important Notice

All shipments of plants, perishable stoek, and cold-storage bulbs are made at buyer's risk only.

If such shipments arrive in bad condition, aceept them and receipt for them aceordingly, and make elaim for your loss on the transportation company. We, of course, will hold ourselves ready to assist you in any possible way. It has been found that elaims can be collected more readily by the person receiving the goods than by the shipper.

Our custom to guarantee the actual arrival of goods (except at points where there is no Freight or Express agent) will still be continued, and elaims for loss or non-arrival of merehandise not perishable will, as in the past, be cared for by us, so you run no risk of having to make claims for lost goods.

## A Few Don'ts

Don't leave bulbs in paper bags or cascs when they are damp.
Don't plant bulbs in soil in which bulbs have been grown before.
Don't put flats or pans on top of the ground after planting.
Don't bury the flats or pans in a warm, sunny, too wet or too dry place; choose a cool sunny corner where the soil is sufficiently moist at all timcs.
Don't take the bulbs into the greenhouse unless well rooted and the buds far cnough advanced.

## Don't Let Your Bulbs Freeze

Every year, near Easter-time, when the florist is looking forward to a banner lot of Hyacinths, Tulips, and Narcissus for sale at that season, there are some who suffer losses they could easily avoid by a little forethought. When potting bulbs, give them a thorough watering and place in a frame-if you have one-on a bed of cinders or ashes. This will allow the excess moisture to drain away. When the bulbs are potted and placed they should be covered with screened ashes or sand to a depth of at least 3 inches above the top of pots. When permanent cold weather sets in, cover with long straw manure (do not use leaves). During severe winter and on cold nights, keep sash on the frames. You cannot expect the best results from bulbs if they are allowed to freeze excessively; it ruins the flower germ.

It is, of course, understood that this suggestion applies to northerly latitudes. In all cases bulbs should be unpacked and stored or planted upon arrival.

Be sure that any change in temperature that you make is gradual; otherwise you will encounter the above conditions.

As the corm is subject to many bacterial and fungus rots, present in a great many soils, our growers recommend soaking the corms in a solution of one part conmercial formaldehyde to 50 parts of lukewarm water for a period of one hour; the corm should be thoroughly dried after treatment bcfore planting. The corm should not be stored for a great length of time, but should be planted as soon as possible after delivery.
