FLOWER SEEDS

Novelties for 1938

NEW ANTIRRHINUM "Rumson Hill"

This new Snapdragon has the unique advantage of being practically everblooming. Seed sown in the greenhouse in June will start flowering early in September, producing a continuous succession of first-class blooms until June.

The color is a soft rose-pink, and the florets are evenly spaced on wiry stems averaging from 2 to 3 feet and require no disbudding. While it is not an exhibition variety, its qualities as a persistent bloomer and graceful habit render it particularly adaptable for bouquets, vases, and general indoor decoration. **Pkt. \$1.50.**

CHRYSANTHEMUM "Golden Crown"

It has the robust constitution of the Coronarium varieties, making vigorous, well branched plants 3-4 feet in height. The bright, double yellow flowers are produced so freely that one plant will carry as many as 50 to 60 blooms. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 50c.**

DIANTHUS, "New Blue"

The color is a bright lavender blue, the foliage is deep green and the flowers are in trusses about 9 inches high. Flowers in July, August, and September. (Perennial). **Pkt. 75c.**

RUSSELL LUPINES

This new strain of perennial Lupins is the most outstanding introduction for many years, and has caused a sensation in horticultural circles. The long, closely furnished spikes flower in a great variety of rich colors—crimsons, scarlets, oranges, yellows, pinks, sky-blues and brilliant bi-colors.

The plants are hardy, unusually vigorous and floriferous, carrying their long, erect spikes clear above the foliage. Awarded a Gold Medal at the R. H. S. meeting, June, 1937. 12 seeds 25c., 50 seeds 65c., 250 seeds \$2.50.

MICHAUXIA CAMPANULOIDES Improved

This little-known plant is worthy of a place in every garden. The flowers are of waxy whiteness and resemble in form that attractive plant "Gloriosa Superba." The bushy, well-branched plants produce freely a large number of flowers. (Hardy Biennial). **Pkt. 50c.**



NOLANA LANCEOLATA, Improved "Blue Ensign"

This is a form of the Chilean Bellflower which was brought over from South America several years ago and has since been converted by careful cultivation into a much superior plant. It can be effectively grown either under glass or in the open ground. In pots it will grow 12 to 15 inches high, or when put outdoors it spreads a little and throws up its lovely large, ultramarine-blue flowers on stems 5 or 6 inches high. In shape these strongly resemble an Ipomoea and their beauty is much enhanced by the large, pure white center which has a charming effect. Seed should be sown in Spring and the plants put out about the end of April, or it may be sown outdoors in May where the plants are to bloom. (Annual). **Pkt. 50c.**

PANSY, "Coronation Gold"

This new giant golden Pansy is of special merit, the flowers are large and of fine texture, the plants are free blooming but compact. The color is a pleasing shade of pure deep yellow, suffused golden orange and without eye. Award of Merit. **Pkt. 50c.**

PRIMULA STELLATA "Samuel Ryder"

The unfolding buds are a bright orange-scarlet, yet the open flowers disclose a shade of pure orange-salmon with a canary-yellow eye. The individual blooms are larger and more fringed than the ordinary "Stellatas." **Pkt. \$1.00.**

SALVIA, "New Dwarf Gem"


This new Salvia is of compact habit, not exceeding 6 to 8 inches in height. It is very early, free flowering, and produces numerous spikes of flowers 4 to 5 inches long of the most vivid scarlet color. Excellent for bedding purposes and for borders. **Pkt. 50c.**

NEW SCABIOSA "Annual Orchid Shades"

Lovely and exquisite beyond description, the colors run through all the tones of the Cattleya Orchid. Soft Mother-of-pearl Pink, Rich Mauves, crushed Strawberry, and the shades known as Orchid and Royal Purple. The flowers are large on long stems and have a delicious, honeylike perfume. \(\frac{1}{8}\) oz·\\$1.00, pkt. 25c.

TITHONIA SPECIOSA GRANDIFLORA "Fireball"

A very brilliant shade of scarlet orange, with a clear yellow center. The flowers are single and measure $4\frac{1}{2}$ to 5 inches in diameter, and are carried on long stems. The plants are very tall, some reaching a height of 8 or 9 feet. "Fireball" is undoubtedly the last word in brilliancy of color in a Fall-blooming plant. (Half-hardy Annual). **Pkt. 25c.**



Recent Novelties and Specialties

AQUILEGIA CLEMATIFLORA

A unique strain of Aquilegia with large, open spurless flowers somewhat resembling Clematis. The plants are of medium height, compact, and free flowering. The color range includes pastel shades of pink and blue. (Hardy Perennial.) Choice Mixed. Pkt. 50c.

CANTERBURY-BELLS Dwarf Bedding

This type grows about 20 inches in height, forming bushes over 3 feet in circumference. It is very floriferous, the plants often bearing 100 to 150 flowers. The colors that have so far appeared are various shades of blue, mauve, and white. (Hardy Biennial.)

ANNUAL CANTERBURY-BELLS

If seeds are sown in gentle heat during February and March, and the seedlings planted out in the garden as soon as danger of frost has passed, the plants will bloom in September.

ESCHSCHOLTZIA "Cherry Ripe"

Large-flowered, of semi-double form. The cup of the flower is deep bright cerise suffused terra cotta at the base. The beauty of the outside of the petals is enhanced by a "plum" sheen. The blending of terra cotta and cerise coloring in the cup makes a bed of Cherry Ripe a most vivid picture. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 50c.**

ESCHSCHOLTZIA "Monarch Art Shades"

A compact strain of large flowering Eschscholtzias and entirely distinct from all other types. The blooms are large, semi-double, and of exquisite formation. The colors range through light rose to deep rose and carmine, and from deep golden yellow through all the various tones to orange and scarlet. (Hardy Annual.)

LARKSPUR "Giant Imperial"

Tall, upright, compact, basal branching in habit, the Giant Imperials have superseded all other types of Larkspurs for florists and general garden use. The Delphiniumlike spikes of double flowers carried on stems 4-5 feet are compactly placed on the upright growing plants. (Hardy Annual.)

The flowers are of perfect rosette form, the color is bright butter yellow and the flowers produced in great profusion. (Half-hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 50c.**

MARIGOLD

New Outstanding Varieties

Collarette, Crown of Gold. An entirely new type of Marigold. The crown or top part of the flower resembles a Chrysanthemum in formation and is made up of long disc petals that beautifully interlace. The crown and the collarette of big, broad petals which surround it are of bright pleasing shade of clear golden orange. Flowers are slightly sweet-scented and the foliage is entirely free of the usual Marigold odor. Plants grow about 2 feet, bloom early and are very floriferous. (Hardy Annual). Pkt. 25c.

Dixie Sunshine. The tall, bushy plants of this charming variety are literally smothered with large, ball-shaped, brilliant golden yellow, double flowers daintily fringed. (Hardy Annual). Pkt. 25c., ¼ oz. \$1.25.

Harmony. A charming and distinct variety of Dwarf French Marigold, flowers of Scabiouslike formation, deep orange crest with maroon collar. Pkt. 25c., ¼ oz. \$1.25.

Sunset Giants. The most remarkable feature is the delicate sweet fragrance of the blossoms. The stems are long and the flowers excellent shippers and range from deep orange to a delightful shade of primrose. Height 3½ to 4 ft. (Hardy Annual). Pkt. 25c.

Yellow Supreme. A large bloom of delicately mild honey fragrance, with broad, loose, frilled petals of a rich, creamy lemon-yellow. Holds freshness fully a week to 10 days when cut. Plants are remarkably healthy, vigorous and free branching with foliage which is practically free from that objectionable Marigold odor. Height 2-2½ ft. (Hardy Annual.) Pkt. 20c., ¼ oz. 75c.

NIGELLA "Dragonfly"

This is quite distinct from the Miss Jekyll type. The flower is single, with thick, fleshy petals and a strong, sturdy stem. It grows from 15-16 inches in height, branches well, and makes a bigger plant than the Jekyll variety. The color is deep dark blue, and there is a delightful sheen on the flower which enhances its richness. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 50c.**

PETUNIA GRANDIFLORA "Dainty Lady"

A new single fringed yellow Petunia which has occasioned favorable comment wherever exhibited. The flowers are of medium size and daintily fringed, and the color is light yellow, deepening to golden yellow at the throat. The plants are neat, compact and somewhat upright in habit. Semi-dwarf and very free flowering. (Half-hardy Annual.) **Pkt. \$1.00.**



PETUNIA PARVIFLORA

A creeping or trailing plant quite distinct from any of the hybrid Petunias, and especially valuable for the Rock Garden. It produces lilac pink blooms about one-fourth of an inch in diameter, the foliage forms a light green mat about 18 inches in diameter, and usually less than 3 inches high. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 25c.**

PHLOX DRUMMONDI GIGANTEA "Art Shades"

This new strain of Phlox drummondi has flowers an inch and a quarter to an inch and a half in diameter. In addition to its enormous flowers it has a most wonderful range of color in soft art shades. The soft colors blended together make a most beautiful mixture and a color combination never before seen in annual Phlox. There is a complete absence of harsh colors in this wonderful mixture and should appeal to those who are looking for soft color effects in their gardens. Plants grow about 9 inches high. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 25c.**

POLYANTHUS "Giant Bouquet"

A magnificent development of this old garden favorite, the flowers being of exceptional size, often 2 inches across. They are produced in great numbers and display an immense variety of coloring, from white to cream, yellow, scarlet, purple and crimson. Borne on long stems, they are excellent for cutting, as well as making a splendid show in the garden. (Hardy Perennial.) Choice Mixed. Pkt. 50c.

POLYANTHUS PRIMROSE "Spetchley Strain"

A lovely strain of Giant-flowered Polyanthus Primroses. The plants are of strong, robust, dwarf growth and the flowers of immense size, ranging through a great variety of beautiful colors and art shades. (Hardy Perennial.) **Pkt. 50c.**

SCABIOSA "FISCHERI"

A fine border plant from Manchuria, hardy and truly perennial, growing about 20 inches high, with handsome divided leaves and blooming well into the Autumn. The flowers are about $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter, borne on long, stiff stems, and are of a rich, deep violet blue shade unlike any other Scabiosa. (Hardy Perennial.) **Pkt. 25c.**

SCABIOSA GRANDIFLORA "Rosette"

A beautiful deep shade of deep rose heavily suffused with salmon. The flowers are extra large and the stems long and stiff. This glorious new color will undoubtedly make Rosette a most popular flower for the garden. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 25c.**

URSINIA ANETHOIDES "Sunstar"

This is a vast improvement on the Ursinia anethoides, the flowers being much larger, often measuring $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches across and of a richer shade of color. It may be best described as a vivid golden orange, the beauty of which is enhanced by a zone of bright chestnut red in the center of the flower. (Half-hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 50c.**

VISCARIA "Blue Pearl"

The color, pure lavender blue, is outstanding and differs from the other blue Viscarias to a degree which makes is absolutely distinct. The lack of that "eye" which is a common character of most sorts adds considerably to its distinction. (Hardy Annual.) **Pkt. 50c.**
