We are listing here some of the very best of the Glads. If you will compare them with the regular prices, you will find these Sets are priced very low. They are made up of variouts siue bulbs so you can see them bloom at different times and under different conditions and the bulblet stock and small bulbs will give you a fine start for another season.

Set 14. Coral Glow (Ellis). This is one of the very best of the Ellis Originations, and so far as we have been able to see, it tops the orange class. It is a very vigorous grower with dark green leaves, and is prolific. Large wide-open florets well placed on straight stems, and unsurpassed in color. We have received many fine reports on this variety. 1 large bulb, 5 medium, 25 small and 100 bulblets, all for $\$ 4.00$.

Set 15. New Era (Ellis). This was Grand Champion in the big Indiana show last summer and has won many awards and ribbons. This spring we had a letter from an Eastern hybridizer saying he has tried hundreds of the best Glads and that New Era is the best of them all. Wonderful ruffling and color and on a warm day an armful of New Era will often have the fragrance of roses. 1 large bulb, 5 medium, 25 small and 100 bulblets for $\$ 1.75$.

Set 16. Wings of Song (Ellis). This was Grand Champion at the Iowa Sncietv Gladiolus Show last summer. Was entered five times in New York a couple of years ago and never beaten and has won a great many ribbons and awards, all as befitting a Picardy seedling. A very beautiful light pink. 5 medium, 25 small bulbs and 100 bu!blets for $\$ 5.00$.

Set 17. Golden Chimes (Ellis). This has won so many ribbons that in Iowa, for the shows there, Golden Chimes has been placed in a special class so as to give the other yellows a chance. Very tall, vigorous, well placed and ruffled. 1 large, 5 medium, and 50 small bulbs and 500 bulblets for $\$ 1.00$.

Set 18. Chief Multnomah (Ellis). This is also a winner of many firsts and is classed by many as the best in the smoky class. It is very tall and large and marked with a unique and brilliant throat blotch. It bears the name of a famous Indian Chief of the early days in Oregon. 1 large, 5 medium, 25 small bulbs, and 200 bulblets, for $\$ 2.00$.

Set 19. Ivory Keys (Ellis). Another winner, both for exhibition and cutflowers. A beautiful frilled white on straight spike. Fine placement. 1 large, 2 medium and 5 small bulbs and 10 bulblets, for $\$ 6.00$.

APACHE CHIEF (Ellis) A tall vigorous bronze. The florets are deep madder brown, suffused with Pompeian red, throat penciled with nopal red on white feathering suffused with begonia rose.
