EARLY GOLDEN ST. CHARLES A Yellow Corn with a White Cob

The ears are of perfect shape each having 14 rows of bright golden yellow grains. Fairly large in size and filled out to the ends. THE COBS ARE WHITE, and with this beautiful color of Yellow makes it a very desirable corn for grinding into cornmeal. It is a real dent corn, the grains are not hard neither are they of a rough nature. The ears are easily shelled, altho the kernals are firm on the Cob and in every respect as perfect type as could possibly be had. It matures in about 85 to 90 days and will make a heavy yield. The price will be \$3.50 per bushel.

EARLY TUSCARORA WHITE A White Corn With a Red Cob
