

Starting with purest white, there are all gradations through pink to deep maroon and through ivory to clear canary yellow. Moreover there are rare opalescent shades impossible to describe.

Because of their striking bi-color effect and grace of form these Single Peonies are greatly admired when used as cut flowers. In the garden, they produce a magnificent effect, challenging the attention of the passerby. Planted in masses, they produce a brilliant display, forming a pleasing element in the landscape. Rars, Exquisite TRÉE PEONIES

REE Peonies are not only one of our rarest shrubs, but also among the choicest flowers grown. They differ from other Peonies in the fact that they do not die back to the ground in the winter time. They produce a woody growth, much like a rhododendron, and keep getting larger and larger each year, eventually becoming quite a large shrub. They usually flower the first year after planting and thereafter they develop year after year, producing larger quantities of gorgeous blossoms each succeeding year. In fact it is not unusual to see a well established plant with 50 or more huge blossoms at one time. They are by far the most handsome of all Peonies and if properly planted and cared for should last a lifetime. They are hardy without protection in the latitude of New York and even further North, where winter temperatures go as low as 25 or 30 degrees below zero. They flower during the month of May on Long Island, two or three weeks ahead of other Peonies. As cut flowers there is nothing more gorgeous and they last a long time when cut. Cultural directions accompany all shipments. The plants will be 2 to 5 years old, grafted on Herbaceous Peony Roots, which is the only satisfactory way to propagate them, but they soon establish strong root systems of their own.
