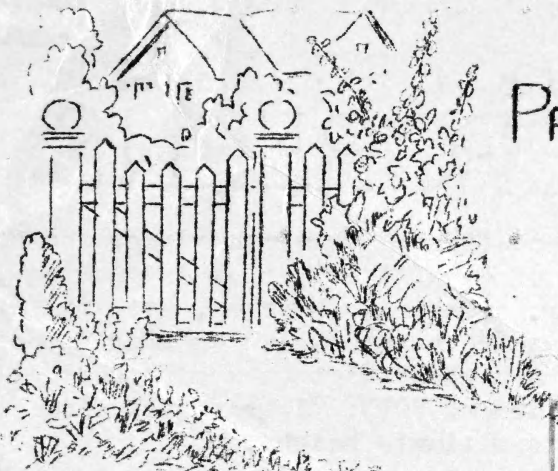

This is our tenth year of intensive work in the breeding, testing and selection of Hardy Garden Chrysanthemums. We are confident that the following list embraces the very finest and best in Garden varieties.

STANDARD VARIETIES

ALGONQUIN. A showy clear yellow double. Tall bushy plant. ht. 30 in., Season very early.

ANN MILLER. Deep russet with bronzy-red undertone. Very showy. Early, double. Ht. 12 in.

ARABY. Fully double flowers of port wine red. The faded blooms are even prettier than when they first open. Season early. Height 30 in.

CRIMSON SPLENDOR. Rich crimson-garnet flowers of very large irregular formation. Season is early. Height 15 in. Flowers are single.

FLASHLIGHT. The outstanding dark red. Large rather shaggy double flowers with petals of brilliant red. Very early, 20 inches high.

GLOMERO. The most prolific pompon we've seen. Bright bronzy orange in color. Season early. Height 25 inches.

KING MIDAS. Large double flowers of a lovely soft yellow, with rich bronze tinting. One of the best for cutting. Early. Ht. 30 in.

"POPULARITY TESTED" MOMS

Standard varieties continued -

LOUISE SCHLING. Single red variety, having three rows of glowing salmon and coppery-red petals. Season early, height 30 inches.

PINK LADY. The best fully double bright pink. Excellent for cutting and long lasting. Season is early, height 15 inches.

ROSE GLOW. Semi-double rose-raspberry blooms borne in tremendous quantities on slender gracefully branching sprays. Early, height 20 inches.

SARANAC. Our best double bright yellow. Stiff stems and good foliage. Very free flowering. Season is early, height 18 inches.

SEPT. QUEEN. Large, double pure white flowers borne in great profusion on dwarf plants. Season is very early, height 18 inches.

SILVER TIPS. Fully double large flowers of bright amaranth pink with a silver sheen that brightens to a silver tip on each petal. Our most popular variety. Season early, height 18 inches.

SUNKIST. An exceedingly brilliant orange double flower on dwarf plants. Blooms profusely. Season early, height 18 inches.

TASIVA. A good double white with creamy center. Season early, height 18 inches.

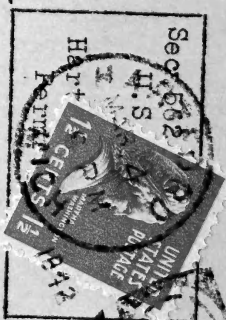
