

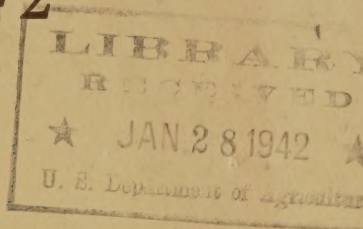

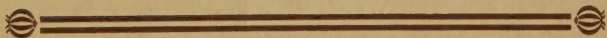

Packing charges will be made on all plant shipments and on other shipments requiring special attention.

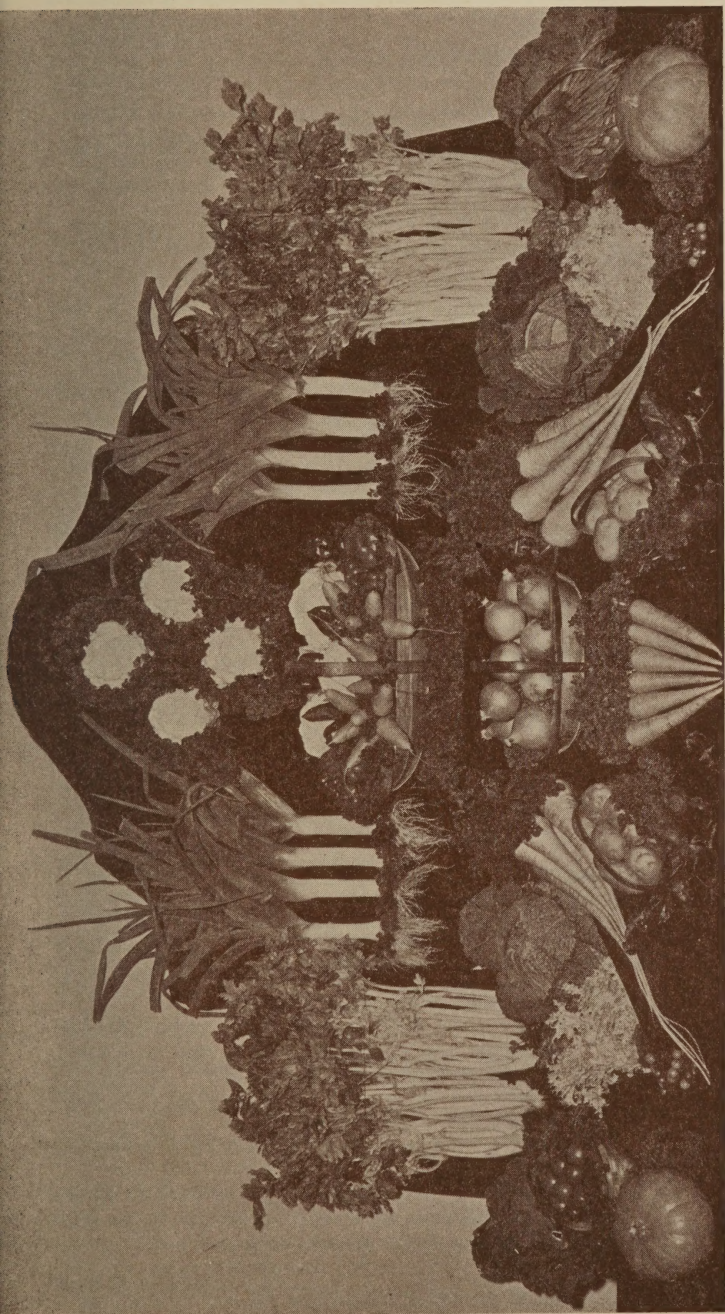
