


Packing charges will be made on all plant shipments and on other shipments requiring special attention.



# Annuals

These play a big part in the great color schemes of brilliant beds and borders in our Summer gardens. Both for garden effect and for cutting their beauty and usefulness is equally valuable.

HARDY ANNUALS. Sow in the open ground where they are intended to bloom. The seeds should be sown thinly and covered with fine soil to a greater or less depth, according to the size of the seed.

HALF-HARDY ANNUALS. The seeds should be sown in pans or frames in the early Spring, and transplanted outdoors in April or May, but previous to removal they should be hardened off by gradually exposing to the open air.
