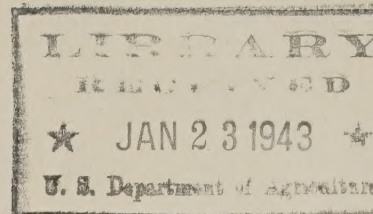

BAKER'S BEST scored 85.8 at Storrs this year and was much admired in the garden there. You will find this dahlia listed on Lynn Dudley's Honor Roll in the Flower Grower.

For the first time we are introducing a dahlia which was not originated at Hillside Farm. This grand dahlia which we have the honor of handling was originated by our friend, Arthur Baker, who has enlisted in the Navy.

Because of the pressure of work we were not able to exhibit BAKER'S BEST this fall, but we feel sure it will be a winner.

The following table shows the amount of money received by the State of Washington from various sources during the years 1943, 1944, and 1945. The total amount received in 1945 was \$1,234,567,000, compared with \$1,123,456,000 in 1944 and \$1,012,345,000 in 1943. The largest source of revenue is the General Fund, which provided \$1,234,567,000 in 1945. Other significant sources include Public Health, Education, Highway, Water, Air, Electricity, Gas, Telephone, Post Office, Railroad, Steamship, Motor Vehicle, Automobile, Truck, Bus, Tram, Streetcar, Light Rail, Subway, Mass Transit, Interurban, Urban, Rural, Express, Local, Overnight, Day, Night, and Seasonal.
