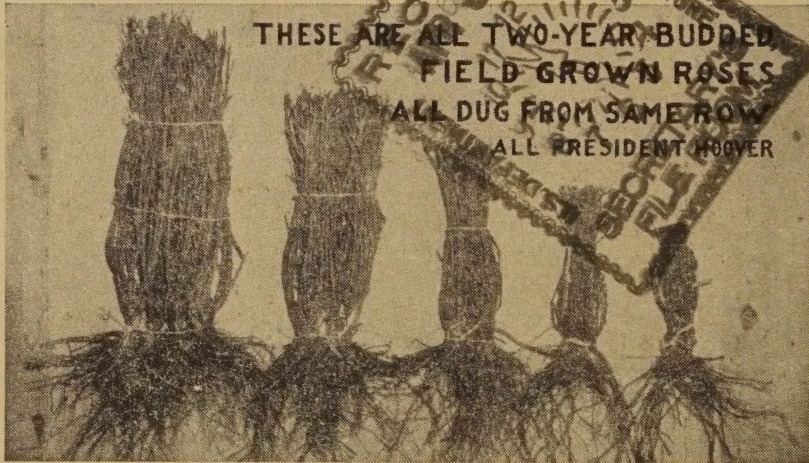

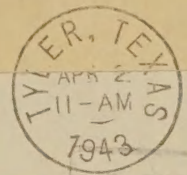
The American Association of Nurserymen has established the following rules for grading the strong growing (like Radiance) Hybrid Tea Roses: No. 1 Grade—3 or more strong canes 18 inches up; No. 1½ Grade—2 or more strong canes 14 inches up; No. 2 Grade—2 or more canes 12 inches up; No. 3 or cull grade—1 or more canes 8 inches up. The No. 3 or cull grade may contain larger plants of poor shape or insufficient roots for the upper grades.
