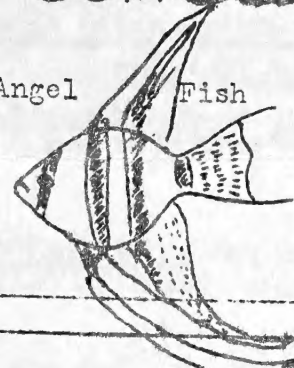

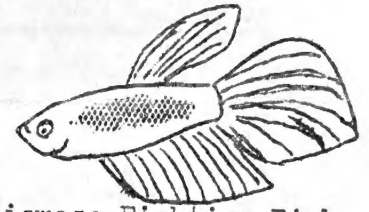

CAUTION!

ROUGH HANDLING

ON ARRIVAL OF FISH, EXAMINE YOUR SHIPMENT CAREFULLY for any signs of -

Wet or torn carton, wet packing, water sloshed out, can turned over, low water level, bruised fish.

If such is the case, get a proper BAD ORDER REPORT from the expressman, stating condition of shipment on arrival. This gives you a basis for claim in case of loss.

NOTE:

Be sure and have the Expressman put on bad order report any and all things that will help in the filing of claim. Delay in delivery is also grounds for a claim.

TO BE VALID, BAD ORDER REPORT MUST BE DATED THE DAY SHIPMENT ARRIVES.

SUGGESTIONS!
BEFORE AND AFTER ARRIVAL
OF FISH

- 1st. Leave your TELEPHONE NUMBER WITH THE EXPRESS PEOPLE, with instructions that they call you immediately on arrival of shipment.
- 2nd. Meet the train and take shipment off yourself, examining shipment for anything referred to under the heading of CAUTION. Eliminate the danger of a shipment being dragged all over town. Long trucking about town is dangerous to shipments in Cold or Hot weather.
- 3rd. Before arrival of fish, have a good clean aquarium ready with seasoned water for the new fish. They should not be put with your other fish for at least two or three days. Strain our water from out of cans, adding it to the water in your waiting aquarium.

Now, float fish in jars into your waiting aquarium, so that the temperature in jar equalizes with that in the aquarium. It is always good to add a teaspoonful of salt to every 5 gallons of water in any new set up aquarium. This helps season the water and acts as a tonic on the new fish put therein. Salt should be first dissolved in a separate container and then added to your aquarium water. This little amount will not hurt Plants or Snails.

PLANTS AND HOW TO HANDLE ON ARRIVAL

In planting up an aquarium for Tropical Fish, it is best to use rooted plants. Tall plants are usually placed in the background, short plants in the foreground. Vallisnerias are usually used for background work, as well as some types of Sagittarias. There are many types of decorative plants listed here, most of which are used as center plants and the type used depends on the size of the aquarium.

Bunch plants usually come with a number of sprigs bunched with a piece of lead around the bottom. The lead should be removed and the plants pushed down into the sand and allowed to root, which they will do easily. Plants sold as cuttings will root the same as bunch plants if pushed down into the sand.

As planting an aquarium is one's own personal taste and viewpoint, we cannot recommend any special way.

FLOATING PLANTS - Even though they have roots, (such as Salvinia, Floating Valentines, Hyacinths, Water Lettuce, Floating Water Fern, etc.) they should be allowed to float and not be planted.

One of the greatest troubles of the average Fancier, is plants spoiling on him and not growing. Lack of sunlight is one of the greatest causes of plant spoilage. With a few exceptions, all Aquarium Plants require at least three to five hours of sun per day, or the equivalent in strong electric light over the aquarium. Plants kept without some direct sun or electric light usually go to pieces.

Sunlight is also good for your fish, as some varieties get the disease called "Rickets", because of the lack of sunlight. Such fish look caved in and seem to have hollow stomachs.
