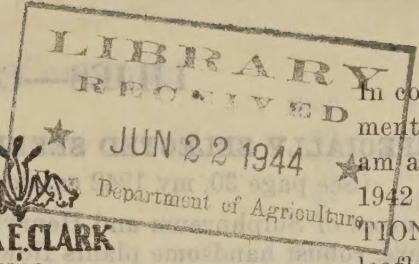
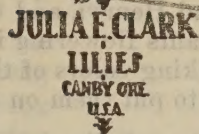

## LILIES

Kindly send cash with your order.

**AURATUM** (This is the "Golden-banded" or "Golden rayed" lily family.) These bulbs are shipped the last of November.

Plant immediately 6 to 9 inches below ground in ordinary soil leaning slightly towards the acid side, where no water stands close to the bulb or roots. Open soils; sand, leaf-mold and bone-meal; slight shade in the heat of the day. No lime and no chemicals that might burn the roots. Frozen ground will not hurt them. Sweetly scented. Bloom Aug.-Sept.

Large white bowl-shaped flowers with central band of gold.

## ESPECIALLY SELECTED SEEDLINGS OF T. A. HAVEMEYER

(See page 30, my 1942 catalog for planting instructions)

T. A. Havemeyer is a cross of Sulphureum and Henryi, and these seedlings propagated by Mr. Kline, have the common trait of easy culture, robust handsome plants flowering in either sun or partial shade, apparently resistant to the common lily diseases, while the lovely, striking colors of these lilies make them cut flowers it would be difficult to equal. I'm delighted that I can be the first to put them on the market.

There are six varieties—any one of them \$25.00 per bulb.

One lovely characteristic of all these varieties is that the base is lettuce green, and the anthers cinnamon brown.

**PAULINA KLINE (15 bulbs).** Majolica yellow shading to saffron yellow, flecked at base of petals oxblood red—back of petals lettuce green. Flower 5½ inches (expanded 8 inches), Height 6 feet.

**MABEL B. RONNA (5 bulbs).** Majolica yellow, stained lemon yellow, flecking oxblood red. Flower 5 inches. Height 8 feet. Very erect.

**WILLIAM BATES (6 bulbs).** Light tangerine orange shading to ivory. Flower 5 inches fully open, slightly recurved. Height 5 feet.

**G. V. SHAW (10 bulbs).** Egyptian buff shading to ivory. Flower size 5 inches fully open, slightly recurved, height 5 feet.

**EDMUND L. KAGY (6 bulbs).** Persimmon orange, light flecking oxblood red. Flower size 8 inches flat, recurved at tips. Height 6 feet, very erect.

**IDA JANE CALIFF (5 bulbs).** Majolica yellow, flecked border one half way to tips, oxblood red. Flower 4½ inches, recurved. Height 3 feet.

**CAROLINIANUM (Michaux).** Swamp lily of southeastern United States.

Fragrant reflexed bright orange-red with purple spots and white throat. 1½ to 3½ Ft. Plant very moist well drained situation, lime free soil. Blooms July-August.

**PETER PUGET**—Cross between Pardalinum and Parryi. Flowers dull light green with recurving capucine yellow segments, red tips, black spotted base. Ht. 4-5 Ft. Blooms June.

**POLYPHYLLUM**—A rare but charmingly fragrant, bell shaped, slightly reflexed lily. Outside dull yellow, inside creamy white, spotted and streaked with lilac. More difficult to grow than some of the lilies as it requires woodland soil, shaded among rhododendrons and ferns with no southern exposure, and deep planting. Ht. 4 Ft. Blooms June.

**PRIDE OF CHARLOTTE**—Cross of Regal and Sargentiae. Blooms much later than Regal and produces stem bulblets. White trumpet, suffused with sulphur—without stained light purple. Hardy, vigorous variety. 4 to 5 Ft.—July blooming.
