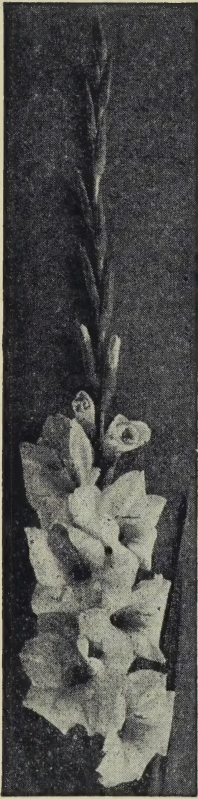
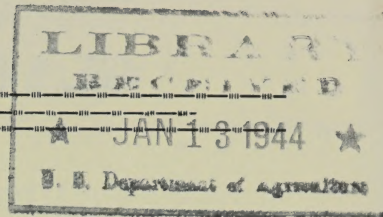

On **ALL** orders taken from the **RETAIL LIST**, you may select as extras: 10% on \$3.00 to \$5.00 orders; 15% on orders from \$5.00 to \$25.00 orders, and 20% on orders from \$25.00 to \$50.00. If you would like any particular variety for discount, kindly mention. We make it a point to include something different for trial. There are a few varieties we cannot give discount on, so please do not figure them in. Also please do not ask for these as extras. No Discount on Lilies.

From the wholesale list you may take 2% discount for cash with order.

## **A Few Comments on New Commercial Possibilities**

It seems to me that now is the time to get started in some of the newer up-to-date commercial varieties. The old standards have doubled and tripled in price, while the newer high priced varieties have not gone up but in many cases have been reduced. You simply cannot go wrong in buying now.

Of all the newer commercials I think **PINK RADIANCE** is the finest in the pink class. Consistency makes a commercial, and Pink Radiance really has it. The color is ideal, form and placement of the best, and opens in water exceptionally well. A fine propagator and bulb maker. **ETHEL CAVE COLE** looks like a fine type and good grower, plus heavy producer. **FLORA FARMER** is simply beautiful but needs strong soil or lots of water. It was outstanding for us this year. **CARILLON** is another well worth growing for cut flowers. **KING WILLIAM** is a Picardy type but a cleaner pink and apricot and is my pick to give Picardy a run.

In the white class, we believe **SNOW PRINCESS** is one better than Maid of Orleans, while **MARGARET BEATON** is in the lime-light with many, but for us **SILENTUM** is a better all around commercial. The scarlet blotch is not as conspicuous but the placement and flower attachment is much better. **LEADING LADY**, white Picardy sport, will not have to take any back seat. **SEPTEMBER WHITE** a

very tall crystal or sparkling white, but in the late blooming class, and a fine rugged grower. SURFSIDE is very consistent. Last but not least our own HEAVENLY WHITE will in a short time take its place along beside Rosa Van Lima, of which it is a sport, as one of the best, most consistent growers of all.

To me none we have ever tried can compete with MOTHER KADEL as a yellow. The reports from all parts of the country, including Porto Rico, are none but the best. INTERMEZZO is another exceptionally consistent grower in the cream class. WANDA, another Picardy sport, is a fine cream also. Of the newer lavenders BADGER BEAUTY is my choice, although ELIZABETH THE QUEEN is a beauty, but even then, I think both may come a little short, under poor growing conditions, but I haven't seen a good, tall, lanky, commercial lavender yet.

ROCKET and VALERIA are still outstanding. Valeria is the tallest, but a little slow on the increase. BLAZE, a Picardy type red, looks real good, but I am told STOPLIGHT is better, although ours froze September 11th, before they bloomed. It is a fine grower and producer.

I like XERXES, believe it or not, and think it will sell in any florist shop. A peculiar color but nice. I'm increasing my own stock. I can't help mentioning BIG TOP. While not necessarily a commercial type, its size and length are something to talk about. I could mention many more but those named have been given a good thorough trial for two or more years, and look good from the commercial angle.



## HEAVENLY WHITE

### COLOR SPORT OF ROSA VAN LIMA

Our first introduction. Has won Honorable Mention in Seedling Class 1942, and Award of Commendation 1943, at our State Shows. In 1942 we cut a single spike with two open on Tuesday and placed it in one of our local meat market coolers, with a temperature of nearly freezing. The following Saturday, it held 10 huge beautifully placed blooms wide open to win the Honorable Mention at one of our State Seedling Shows.

The color is a sparkling blue white resembling the white clouds floating in a blue sky. Some have called it a very pale lavender, but personally I cannot see it as a lavender. At a short distance it's just a pure white with a faint lavender marking in the throat.

Like its parent plant, it is a robust, heavy grower, making quantities of bulblets that will grow for anyone. Its commercial possibilities should be even better than Rosa Van Lima itself. We bought Rosa Van Lima in quantity the first year of its introduction into this country and frankly it has made us more money than any other variety in our 15 years of growing glads. We are sure that HEAVENLY WHITE will come through also.

However, we only ask you to give it a trial and if you do not think it worthy of the name and price, we will gladly return your money in full. It's what you think that will make it or defeat it.

Price for either large or medium bulbs only \$2.00 each. No bulblets this year, and not more than three bulbs to a customer. No discount.

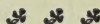
