Please Read Before Ordering

DELIVERY OF SEEDS

All Vegetable and Flower Seeds in this price list except Peas, Beans and Sweet Corn will be sent to places in the United States transportation charges prepaid. We will ship by parcel post, express or freight **at our option**. If seeds are ordered shipped by express where we would ship by freight, they will be sent by **express collect**.

Peas, Beans and Sweet Corn will be shipped at purchaser's expense, except as follows: If these seeds are included in any one order amounting to \$20.00 or more (not including Farm Seeds, Accessories, etc.) we will prepay transportation charges.

We will **not** pay transportation charges on **Field and Grass Seed, Potatoes, Onion Sets, Accessories, Etc.** These articles are always sent at **purchaser's expense**, except where they are quoted "Transportation paid" in this price list.

If your order includes items on which we do not pay transportation, please indicate how you want them shipped, whether by parcel post, express or freight.

When ordering seeds shipped by freight or express please be sure to give the name of your nearest freight railroad station or express office if it is different from your post office address.

Freight shipments are now slow and even mail and express are sometimes delayed, so please send in your order well ahead of the time you wish to use the seeds.

TERMS AND DISCOUNTS

Cash discount now 3%

Our regular terms are **cash with order**, for which we now allow a **discount of 3%** on vegetable and flower seeds and plants only.

No cash discount is allowed on Potatoes, Field Corn or Field Seeds, Grass Seeds, Insecticides and Accessories. All these items are strictly **net cash with order** at prices quoted.

C.O.D. SHIPMENTS. 25% of the value of the order must be sent with all orders for goods to be shipped C.O.D. **No cash discount is allowed on C.O.D. shipments.** Orders are handled more quickly and are less subject to delay if full cash payment accompanies the order.

Plants, roots, onion sets, etc. will not be sent C.O.D.

To **Market Gardeners** of established credit and those who furnish us with satisfactory references, we allow the following time payments **on vegetable seeds and plants.** (*Field and Grass seed, Potatoes, etc. are strictly cash with order and may not be charged.*)

Bills for seeds, plants, etc. shipped after December 1st are due and payable **net** August 1st.

Bills for goods shipped after August 1 are due **net** December 1st.

To **Florists** of established credit we allow the following time payments on **flower seeds and plants.**

Bills for seeds, plants, etc. shipped after December 1st are due and payable **net** June 1st.

Bills for goods shipped after June 1st, are due **net** December 1st.

CONDITIONS OF SALE

No seeds are sold by us that we do not know are of good vitality and will grow under normal conditions. They are all tested and the per cent that germinates is marked on the package or label.

We assume responsibility of the seeds, plants and bulbs reaching the purchaser in good condition. However, in common with all responsible seedsmen, we give no warranty, express or implied as to the productiveness of any seeds, plants or bulbs we sell, and we will not be in any way responsible for the crop. Our liability in all instances is limited to the purchase price of the seed. We will not accept or fill orders under any other conditions.

Harris special strains, grown and developed on our farms here in the North, are perfectly adapted to meet these modern markets. We supply not only the finest of the standard varieties but offer many improved new kinds, such as New Long Tendergreen Beans, Fordhook U. S. 242 Lima Beans, North Star and Carmelcross corn, Marketer cucumber, Iroquois melon and many others. All through the war we have kept up our very high standards, maintaining our breeding work and our extensive trial grounds, and we will sell only the very best seed obtainable.

To meet the constantly increasing demand for Harris Seeds we have increased our capacity and have made many improvements in our methods of handling and filling orders. We are now ready to offer prompt efficient service to our market gardener and florist customers.

Vegetable seeds are in better supply this year, but really good stocks of many kinds are still scarce. In spite of our greatly expanded production we will undoubtedly be sold out of many of our special lines before planting time. We urge our customers to place their orders just as early as possible.

ALLOW PLENTY OF TIME FOR YOUR ORDER TO REACH YOU

The railroads are doing a magnificent job of moving war material, but they are severely over crowded and nearly all shipments are handled much more slowly than before. This applies not only to freight, which is frequently delayed, but even to mail and express.

Therefore we urge our customers to order their seeds well ahead of the time they wish to plant, and to be patient if they are not received as quickly as in the past.

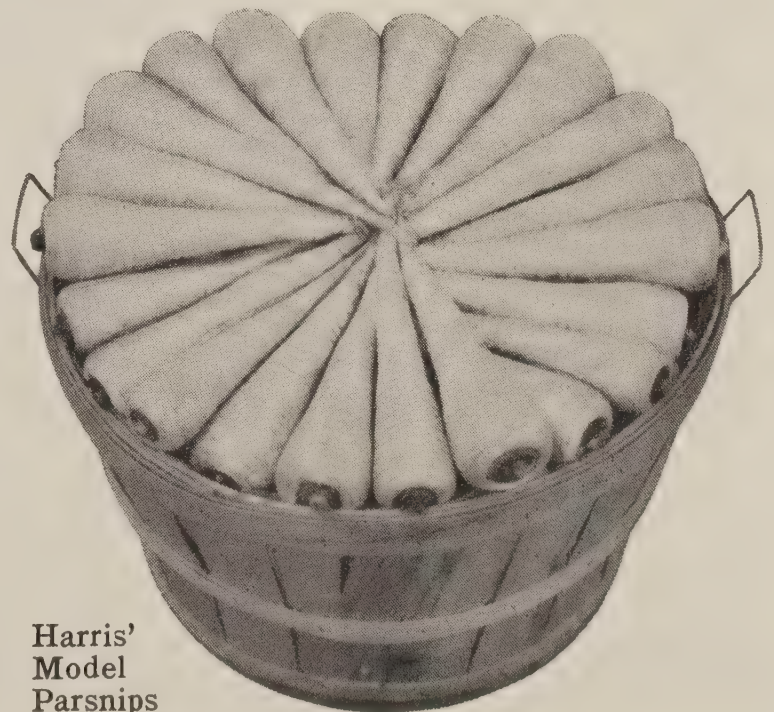

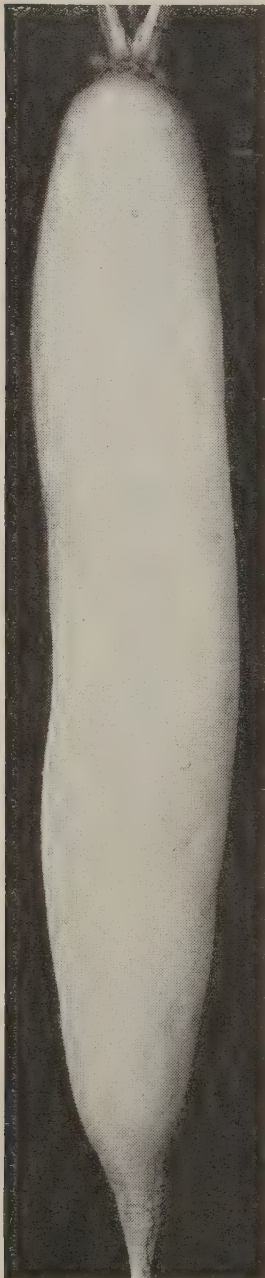

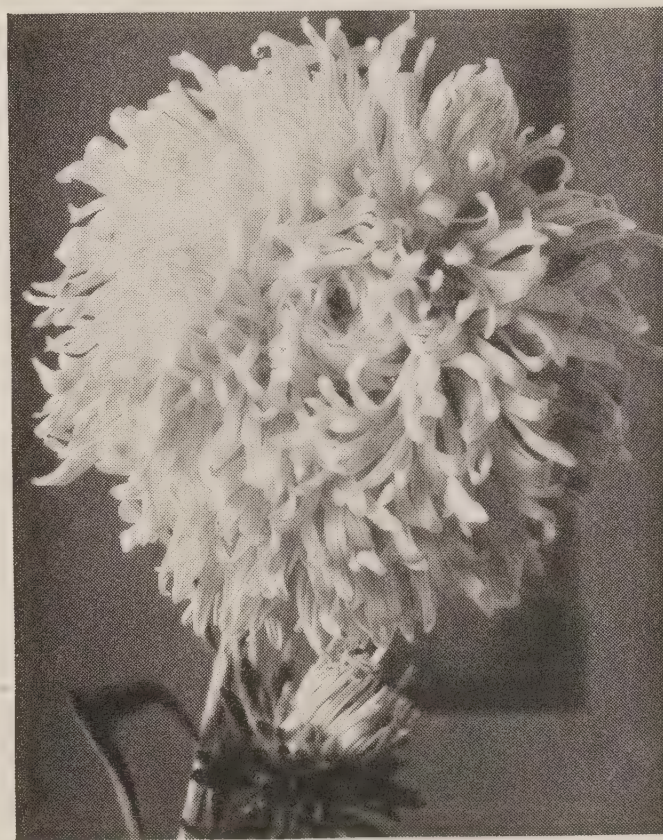

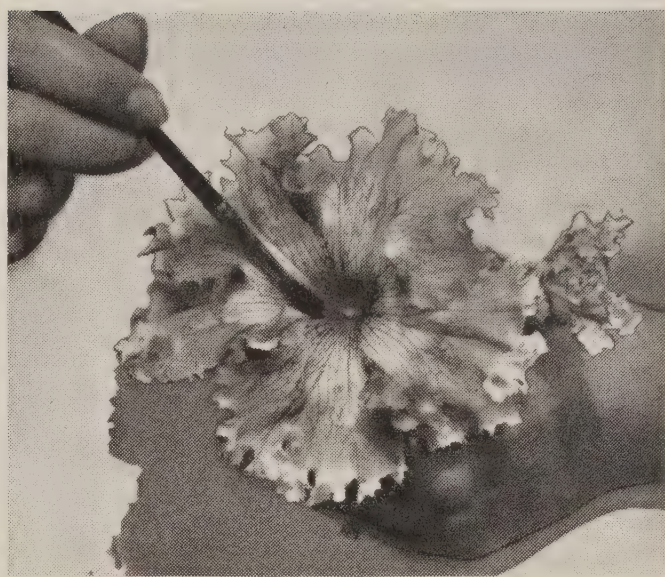

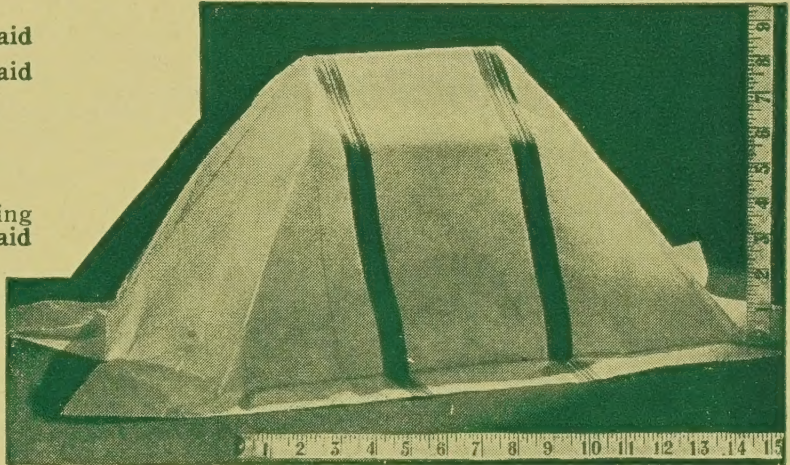


Photo shows size and shape of Hotent
