

However, we doubt if any Alfalfa will be supplied under Lend-Lease because of the critical situation existing for our own supplies, and probably only a very small amount of the desired tonnage will be supplied on Red Clover and Alsike.

Considering the shortages, we have accumulated very good stocks, and we are going to take care of you just as long as possible. The only thing I can say is to ORDER EARLY and have your seed on hand when planting time comes
