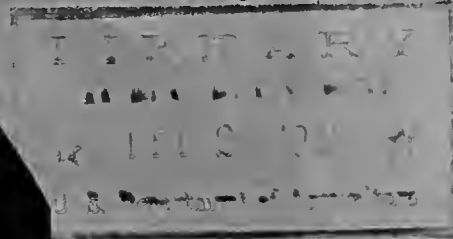

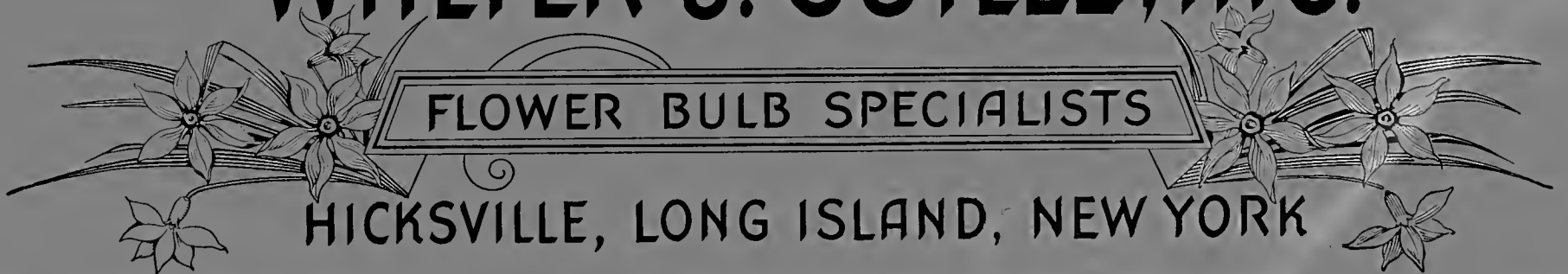

- Andrea Ericson.** (I. D.) A large and shapely flower with long, curly petals of purest white. Can be grown from 9 to 12 inches under good cultural conditions25
- Atlantic City.** (F. D.) Amber-gold intensified with orange, salmon and hint of bronze. It is a most profuse and early bloomer flowering from mid-July until frost. Splendid for cutting.12
- Avalon** (I. D.) Beautiful clear yellow and the best of this color for commercial use. Fine form on long stems. Its one fault of somewhat weak stems can be controlled by careful disbudding.08

- Ballego's Surprise.** (S. C.) A fine new semi-cactus white from Holland. Formation is very similar to Frau O'Bracht but the flower is deeper and has more petals. This variety promises to be a valuable addition to the commercial list.75
