Plant dependable, high yielding and disease resistant varieties listed on this page. Any plants that show signs of disease should be removed and burned. Plant early as possible in the spring. In order to promote strong, stocky plants pinch tops of canes, when 18 inches tall, each summer. this makes more lateral branches resulting in heavier yields. Liberal quantities of manure and high nitrogen fertilizers are very beneficial. To maintain clean thrifty plants and control anthracnose use 1 lb. dry lime and sulphur to 5 gallons of water and spray in early spring before foliage starts. Also advisable to dust foliage throughout summer with sulphur. Cultivate regularly throughout the summer checking growth in late August because of danger from winter injury.
