



# LIGHT YOUR ASTERS FOR EARLIER FLOWERING

March is the time to start your Asters for cloth houses. In order to save time and get the crop ready when prices are good, some of your Asters should be lighted. Some of you may be acquainted with the directions, but for those of you who are not, this is written.

When the seedlings are ready to prick-off into pots or bands or flats, start lighting. Use 25-40 watt lamps spaced five feet apart and two feet above the bench. Apply from dusk and for three or four hours thereafter each day. Continue lighting until the plants, are ready to set out.







#### **GLOXINIA CULTURE**

Gloxinias are fit companions for the tuberous rooted Begonias and the fancy leaved Caladiums. Their richly colored flowers are most outstanding. Start the tubers in 4-inch pots in a mixture of leaf mold, sand and a little wellrotted cow manure with good bottom heat. Keep shaded and as the leaves appear, be careful with the watering. You cannot do it with the hose, so make use of the old-fashioned way, the watering can, and go over each plant carefully, examine every one and don't apply water unless it is needed, on the other hand, they suffer every bit as much if they don't get water when ready for it, for they want a moist soil. Keep the leaves dry. To get them moist on a hot day early in the morning doesn't hurt, but they soon go if you wet them every time you water the plants. They want most of all a little shade, but if you overdo it you may obtain foliage but no flowers.

The bulbs are placed in boxes, on light porous soil close together, and then covered with earth to a depth of one inch above the bulb. The earth should be kept just moist, too much water will rot the bulbs.

When the plants begin to develop they are placed in pots.





An exquisitetly colored, well rounded, large pompon blooming November 5. The color is a beautiful blend of orange, red and chrome bronze similar to Natoma. The habit of growth is clean, uniform, and vigorous with excellent foliage and well branched sprays. The scintillating color is an epoch in chrysanthemum breeding but it is sensitive to intense light and is, therefore, best adapted to later greenhouse shadings and natural flowering. It possesses greater vigor and is easiar to grow than Natoma. The production excels that of Navaho.

The response of Brocade to shading is similar to that of Masterpiece and should be grouped with that variety in the shading program. Brocade is the pink daisy to complement Masterpiece in later shadings and natural flowering. For a mid-season pink single to fill the gap between the early pink singles, Oct. Pink and W. H. Buckingham, and the later variety, Valencia, we suggest Brocade.

Caroline Yosick gives a sharp and uniform response to black cloth shade and its major value is for August and September flowering. It compliments and completes an important trio for early shading—Caroline Yosick, Pinocchio, and Gold Coast. It has a very dependable growth habit, does not crown like Jewell, and has a much more rigid stem than Jessie and Pink Dot. The small, decorative flower of Caroline Yosick possesses excellent color holding quality, and is very satisfactory under even the earliest shadings. Its color is not outstanding in natural daylight but brightens or softens remarkably under artificial lights. We suggest that you wait to evaluate this variety until the reports from the wholesalers are received.

# AN AUTHORITATIVE ARTICLE BY **Alex Laurie** PROFESSOR OF FLORICULTURE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY

The popularity of the crysanthemum has made it a universally grown crop. Practically every grower of miscellaneous flowering crops includes the chrysanthemum in his program of rotation. Unfortunately the comparative ease of culture of this crop results frequently in neglect and sloppy methods. With competition becoming greater in the post-war period, quality becomes essential and to produce quality the chrysanthemum should not be treated as a step-child and given inadequate care. Lack of attention to stock plants, untimely propagation, use of weak cuttings, hardening of plants before benching, allowing insects and disease to become rampant, growing plants to too many stems, bunching improperly and handling the cut stock roughly, are some of the glaring inadequacies of culture
