GIANT HANGING BASKET —

Sometimes listed as Pendula or Lloydii. Double flowering plants especially adapted for planting in shaded window boxes, hanging baskets and we suggest them as being unusually attractive when planted in the rockery. A few of these plants in the rockery will supply brilliant color all summer. While flowers this type produces are not large compared to the camellia type they are so profusely developed that the plant is always a mass of color. General Culture

There are many of this group but we have selected and listed here, those that are most desirable. The Giant Camellia Double, Giant Carnation Flowered and Hanging Basket types are the most popular and the ones most often seen. We suggest all gardeners taking up the culture of this plant use these as the basis of their selection. Collecting Tuberos Begonias, however, is a fascinating hobby with many and starting from these principle types you will find much interest in trying the novelties we offer. It is to be remembered that Tuberos Begonias generally produce a male and female flower on the same plant. One is single and the other, the one that types the variety is double or otherwise different according to the variety.

Tuberos Begonias are usually propagated from seeds although they may be increased by cuttings and dividing the tuber. Neither of these methods appeal much to the gardener except those of experimental bent. They are methods offering rewards but somewhat technical. It is generally simpler to plant the tubers. In spite of the wide spread belief that the largest tubers give best results this is not true. A medium sized tuber of one or two years age produces the finest plant specimen and flower size and it is for that reason we supply ONLY this quality. We send out only vigorous, hand selected, young stock which you may, with care, grow successfully for four to six years and longer.

When you receive our tubers prepare for planting by mixing a soil consisting of two parts good garden loam, one part leaf mould of hard wood leaves or peat moss and one part rotted cow manure. MIX WELL. Tubers may be planted in a small box (box to be 4 in. deep) in this soil about 5x5 inches apart or potted singly in flower pots not smaller than 5 inch size — larger if they are to be flowered in the pots. Keep in a temperature of 60 to 70 degrees until well started. AFTER PLANTING AND UNTIL LEAF GROWTH STARTS USE EXTREME CARE NOT TO KEEP TOO WET. These tubers will start on a perfectly dry shelf as the season advances but they will not stand excessive moisture in soil until leaf growth starts. Keep soil just moist through — NEVER WET until growth is started. THIS IS IMPORTANT and inattention to this may cause tubers to rot. Keep at about the same temperature range until set out of doors but water more heavily as leaf growth develops.

Now in planting the tubers it will be noted that on one side there is an indentation. It is from this that the leaf growth comes so be sure that this side of the tuber is planted UP. The root fibers develop on the smooth, rounded bottom of the tuber and we warn you about this

as we have often seen inexperienced gardeners plant the tubers upside down and wonder why they did not grow. Be careful not to plant too deep. The top of the tuber should be 1/2 to 1 inch below the surface. It is advisable, where the tuber has a deep indentation at the stem eye to plant at a slanted angle to prevent water from collecting in this indentation and rotting the tuber before it starts.

Planting into outdoor beds for summer flowering should not be done until ALL danger of frost is past. As with most all Begonias these prefer positions protected from hot sun and drying winds and they may best be planted on northern and eastern exposures. They will thrive in almost total shade better than any plant we know of though early morning sun for a few hours is desirable. Soil should be of about the same composition as recommended for starting and they will not tolerate a lack of moisture during the flowering season. This is because of their shallow rooting habit. Also because of this they should not be cultivated deeply. It is better to mulch the bed with peat moss or rotted cow manure rather than having to be constantly disturbing the surface around the plants. Drainage must be good and on no account must the plants be allowed to suffer from lack of water once leaf growth is well started until they start curing off after the blooming season is about over. This will usually be about three weeks before frost.

They may be stimulated during the flowering season by the application of cow manure water. A good schedule is to water every day and use the manure water once a week. This may be prepared by placing several shovels full of cow manure in a burlap sack and placing it in a keg or similar container. Cover with water and let stand. About every sixth or eighth watering dip off some of this water and dilute about 50% with tap water and sprinkle plants liberally. This is perfectly safe and is recommended for general use around your flowers. Refill the container with water and let stand for next application. Replace manure after fourth or fifth refill.

Tuberos Begonias have but few pests and no serious diseases. In some localities the tubers are destroyed by white larva. This usually seems to occur when fresh manures are used. Slugs may eat the foliage and treatment is the same as for this pest on other plants — either pick them after dark or bait for them. The plants sometimes drop their flowers and this may be caused by many things. About the only information that can be given on this is that it is an indication that cultural conditions are not to the plants liking. They enjoy light syringing of the foliage and flowers with a gentle spray. This is to be recommended when humidity is low and/or when the temperature raises above normal.

When signs of ripening begin to show, gradually withhold water until the tops ripen off. Sometimes, because of frost, tops will have to be cut while quite green. If in pots lay pot on its side in a moderately dry place at about 40 degrees indoors. If they are in beds they should be dug just before frost and stored over their rest period in a small box of dry peat moss or sand. This must be quite dry but is best if not thoroughly so. If too dry the tubers dehydrate quite badly. The following February or March the tubers may again be planted and the cycle repeated with the same tubers.

A WORD ABOUT TIME TO PLANT: We prefer to plant not before the First of February and good success may be expected if culture is good by planting as late as the latter part of May. We prefer the time between February and April Twentieth under average condition with American tubers.

While these tubers are easily started and grown there is usually some mortality to be expected. We anticipate about 2 to 5% in our own plantings. This seems to be unavoidable with these the same as seed have a normal mortality rate and if your losses are greater than this you can be sure it is because of your culture. Follow these cultural suggestions quite closely for best results. We have used great care to hand-select young stock which will be at prime this year and next and they will give you good results with reasonable attention and care.

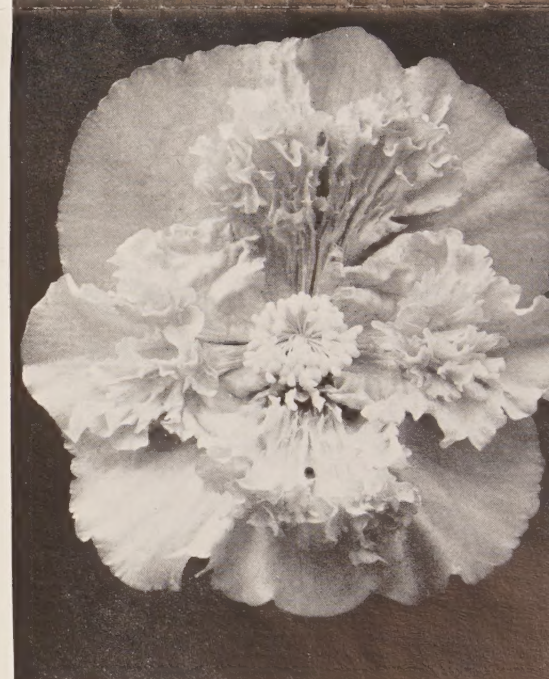
