IT WILL SOON BE SEEDING TIME

Another holiday season has come and gone and a new year is well started. Some folks have already ordered seed and shipment has been made. Many others will be ordering in the next few weeks. Much of our seed is in or will soon arrive and with few exceptions there will be adequate supplies of all items.

We think Scott customers will be well pleased with the high quality of seed this season. Clean, noxious weed free, high germinating seed is still the most economical to use and produces the most satisfactory crops. While prices for good seed average but little above those of a year ago we have noticed more off quality "bargain type" seed being offered. Low priced seed always has something wrong with it and there is no reason for an exception now.

SEED OATS - We wish we could have had more Clintons. A few bushels of Indiana Certified were offered last week at eight dollars and we understand some have been sold at fifteen dollars per bushel. By another year more will be available and at reasonable prices. High purity Columbia seed is scarce as the Viclands have largely taken over the acreage where Columbias were grown. The uncertified Viclands offered are from certified seed and all oats and barley are well cleaned and treated.

CLOVERS - ALFALFA - The seed is good quality and nice in color. Northern grown Grimm is not listed as it has been so much out of line in price compared to other good alfalfa varieties. Buffalo and Ranger alfalfa and Birdsfoot trefoil seed is limited but other clover and alfalfa seeds are ample.

MEADOW - PASTURE MIXTURES - Contain only top quality seed. They are convenient to order and sow; and Experiment Station recommendations are closely followed in the formulas used. More customers each year are ordering Scott Mixtures and are reporting excellent hay and pasture crops.

HYBRID CORN - "Select a Hybrid to Fit Your Farm" which we hope you will like, is enclosed. All Scott hybrid seed is graded for width, length, and thickness, is treated, is high in quality and germination. Tests have consistently run above 95% strong sprouts. Most varieties are or soon will be ready for shipment.

SOYBEANS - We wish we knew the answer on soybean seed supplies. With high prices for beans at harvest for milling purposes, many farmers sold their entire production and we don't believe seed will be too plentiful. Please notice that our quotations include inoculation at no additional cost.

SILAGE BLEND FLATS—Early and Late hybrid blends are offered, with the Early recommended for short season use, Late for full season plantings. All seed is uniformly graded for width, length and thickness, is above 90% germination, is treated, and consists of medium small flat kernels. Maturity variation within each blend does not exceed 10 days. Will plant 8 to 10 acres per bushel. High yields of ears and fodder in the right balance for top quality feed.

SCOTTS 11—Fully as early as Ohio M 15. Large ears for an early hybrid. Has outyielded Ohio M 15. Sound dark yellow ears. Seed supplies limited for this year.

SCOTTS 22—The maturity of Ohio M 34. Has been an excellent producer on different soil types. Good roots, sound ears, good quality fodder.
