

Large Size

The Hon-ee-gold peach is a marvel in size, being slightly on the round type, 10% larger than Elberta, and ripens very late on the tree. Has a beautiful red cheek and packs up beautifully in the bushel.

Shipping Qualities

As to shipping qualities Hon-ee-gold is the best. In our tests this peach simply does not rot, but dehydrates and virtually dries up before rotting. Skin texture is heavy like Elberta, thus making an excellent peach for shipping.

Flavor

Hon-ee-gold has an excellent flavor, being golden yellow inside with a slight amount of red next to the pit. Somewhat on the dry side, which helps its shipping qualities.

Hardy Trees

The commercial grower should look into the hardiness of any variety he plants for long life. Hon-eegold is a very thrifty upright growing tree. Has never winterkilled or shown any winter injury whatsoever here. We want every peach grower to plant one tree this year. Hon-ee-gold has everything that a real peach needs. Freestone.

Pear shaped fruit of medium size with good quality white shading to pink flesh. Copper brown skin. Prolific and of the dwarf type. Very hardy.

Figs need to be planted on reasonably good soil. If the land gets too rich they make too fast a growth and forget to bear. If it gets cold and kills the plants, cut them back to the ground and let them come up again. If the soil is right, these young plants will begin to





put on figs by the time they are a foot high. As these trees do not grow to a very large size, they can be easily protected by covering with straw or any leafy material, provided cold weather hits them before they are ripe. Place a circle of chicken net around the tree and fill this entirely with straw which will give them complete protection.

Especially hardy fig that will grow where many varieties fail to grow.




FALL SHIPMENTS

Parcel Post: We can send your orders by parcel post if you prefer, where there is no express office nearby. In shipping bundles, it is economical for you to pay the postage in advance, thus saving the 15 cents (C.O.D.) fee collected by the Post Office Department on delivery. We have arranged a schedule for you at right, so you can see approximately what the charge will be and in what section you are located. (After your order is shipped and if we find you have sent too much money, we will refund same to you at once.) However, if you should prefer to have your stock sent C.O.D. for postage charges, we will be glad to send it to you in that manner. If parcel post shipment is requested and shipping charges not included, we naturally assume that you want plants shipped C.O.D. for the postage.

Express: We recommend Express shipments because the express rates have been reduced. Shipments take the second class rate and are sent collect for the exact amount of the shipping charges. This is the fairest way for you pay only the exact amount on your package,

Generally all shade and fruit trees, and large quantities of stock must be sent by Express. Over one hundred raspberies, one-year plants, 50 raspberries, 2-yr. plants, over 5 fruit trees would go cheaper by express, especially on long distance shipments. We have worked out this plan of shipping to be the best way for you, with the least cost to you. Freight: Freight can be used when orders call for several hundred fruit trees or several thousand cane plants, and are

to be shipped during early March or April.

Strawberry Plants Are Never Shipped By Freight: If undecided as to how to have your order sent, just give us your post office and nearest shipping point and we will route the

cheapest and safest way.

Your Remittance: Send a postal or express money order if possible; cash should be sent by registered mail, for we will not be responsible for loss if mailed in the ordinary manner. Personal checks will be accepted.


