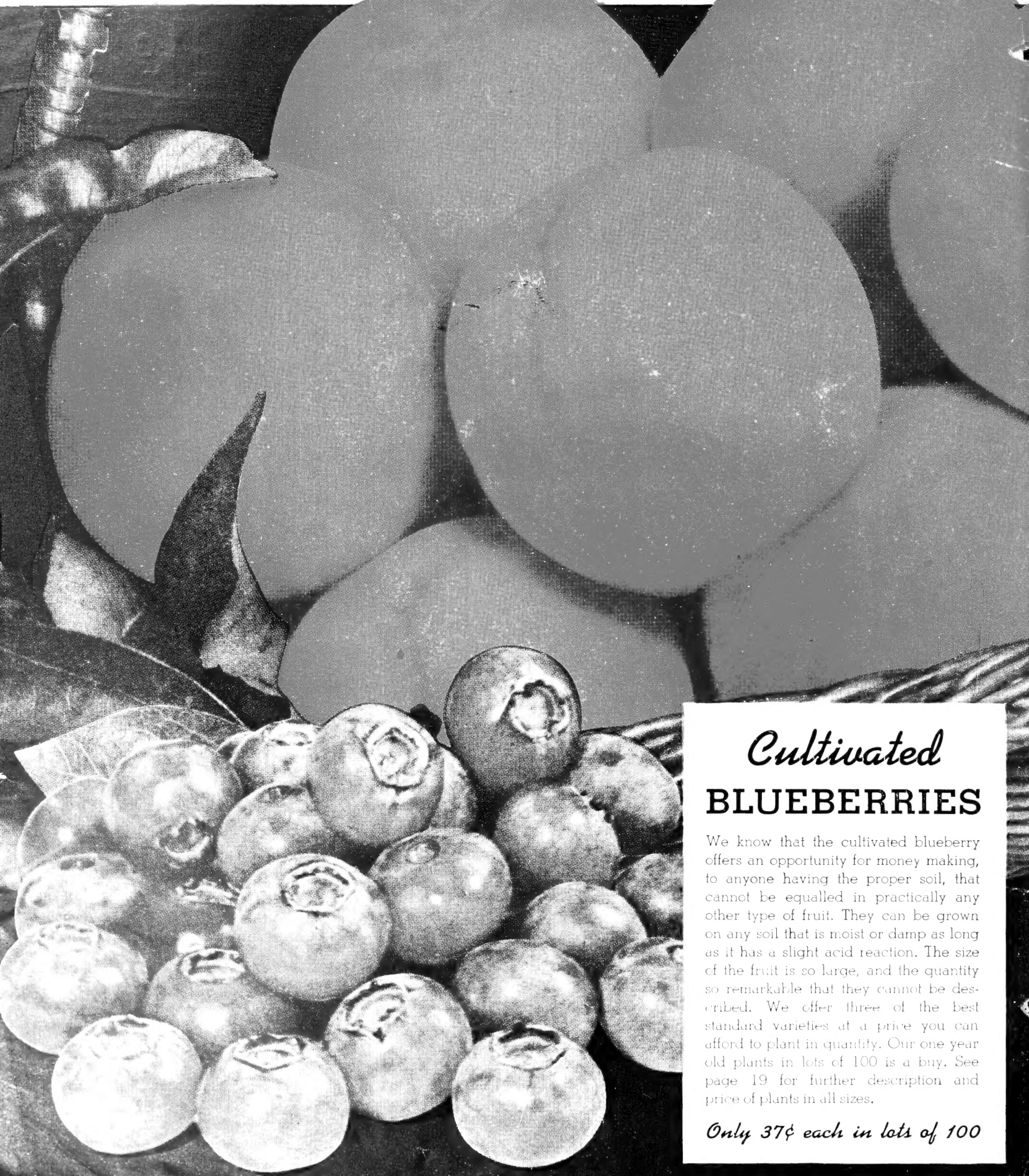

Flavor

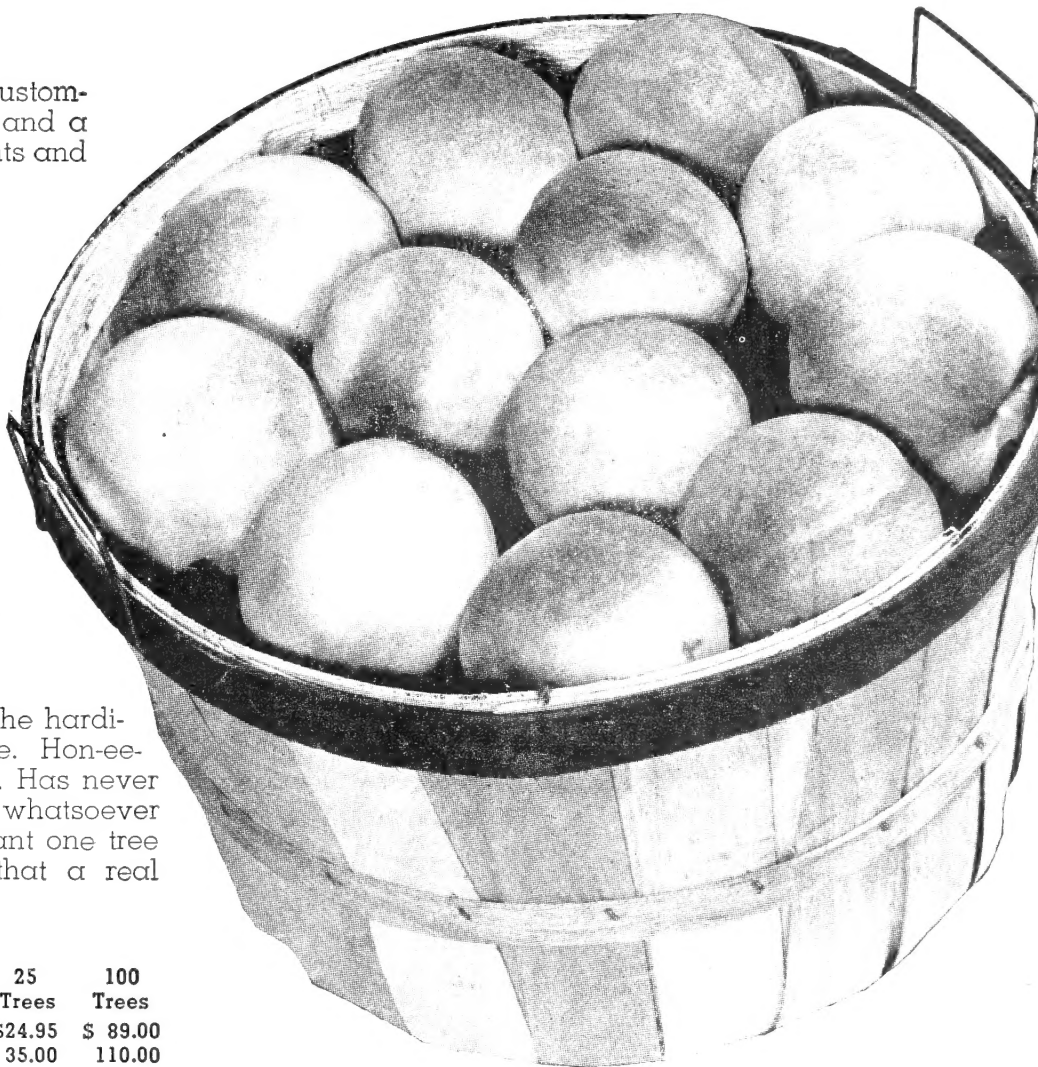

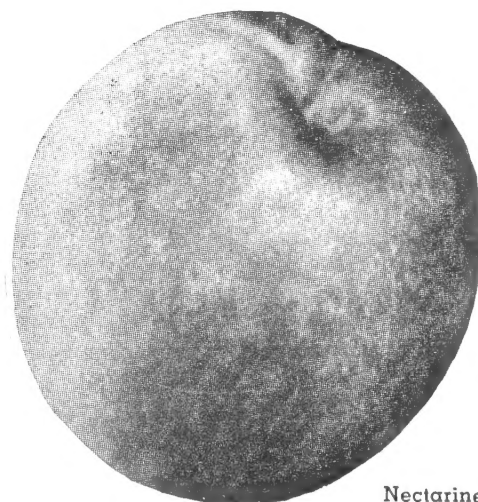
Figs need to be planted on reasonably good soil. If the land gets too rich they make too fast a growth and forget to bear. If it gets cold and kills the plants, cut them back to the ground and let them come up again. If the soil is right, these young plants will begin to put on figs by the time they are a foot high. As these trees do not grow to a very large size, they can be easily protected by covering with straw or any leafy material, provided cold weather hits them before they are ripe. Place a circle of chicken net around the tree and fill this entirely with straw which will give them complete protection.
