D A Y L I L Y L I S T

July, 1947

- Daylilies require:
1. Room to grow.
 2. Time to become established.
 3. Sunlight for part of the day.
 4. Food - preferably organic - once a year.
 5. Adequate moisture at blooming time.

The varieties listed below are our own hybrids. They have been growing in our garden for three years or more and have been carefully checked and evaluated. They present a wide range of color and form, and, in our judgment, possess more than usual garden value.

The descriptions are our own, but the color references are to Paul & Maerz' "A Dictionary of Color."

We are offering them at the introductory price of \$3.00 each. Since they are in very limited supply, do not order unless you are willing to wait your turn with patience.

CLUNY BROWN (#127) - Description from Herbertia, Volume 12: Bicolor; petals brown (Windsor tan, Pl. 13 G 12) with yellow (light chrome, Pl. 10 L 4) midrib; sepals light chrome, lightly brushed at edges with petal color; wide yellow (light chrome) throat. Form full, regular; substance, heavy; texture, smooth. Scapes many branched, stiffly erect, 30". Evergreen foliage. Early and recurrent bloomer. Not available until 1948.

FLORIDA GOLD (#230) - Showy flower of velvet like texture, 6" in size. Throat and center of blades, Florida gold (Pl. 10 L 8) shading to Chinese yellow. Petals have wavy margins and raised midrib. Striking in the garden for size, color and long season of bloom. Small number available for late Summer or Fall shipment.

GARDEN FLAME (#75) - Height 36". Evergreen foliage. Large flower, totem red (Pl. 4 J 12) with sepals slightly lighter. Throat near sunkist (Pl. 9 L 9). Not available until 1948.

HELEN FIELD FISCHER (3-X) - Medium tall, medium sized apricot flower (Pl. 10 F 7). Throat shading from lemon yellow (Pl. 10 K 3) to golden yellow (Pl. 10 L 7) banded with Egyptian red (Pl. 6 L 11). Better in semi-shade, but, when grown in full sun, fades evenly. Very floriferous and a recurrent bloomer in Florida. Evergreen foliage. A few plants available late Summer.

LOCHINVAR (#15) - Height 30". Evergreen foliage. Large, widely opened flower with broad shallow throat. Petals ember red (Pl. 5 K 10). Faint eye zone. Sepals same. Throat cadmium yellow (Pl. 9 L 8). Early bloomer with long flowering season. Available Spring, 1948.

MANDALAY (#72) - Height 42". Evergreen foliage. Flower large, 6" standing. Near saffron yellow (Pl. 10 J 8) with throat lemon yellow (Pl. 10 K 3) shading to golden yellow (Pl. 10 L 7). Petals ruffled. Very showy in the garden. Available for late Summer or Fall shipping.

OLIVE BALDWIN (#3-W) - Height 36". Evergreen foliage. Flower round and regular with overlapping petals, 5" standing. Basic color terra cotta (Pl. 4 D 12) with darker veining. Very wide petals, sepals narrower, lighter; recurved. Throat shading from sulphur yellow (Pl. 10 J 1) to light chrome (Pl. 10 I 1). Crinkled texture. Recurrent bloomer in Florida. A few plants available late Summer.

PRIMA DONNA (2-X) - Described in *Herbertia*, Volume 12. A very large peach colored flower with golden yellow throat that comes up on the petals and sepals in a convex arch in an interesting effect. Midseason bloomer with long season of flowering. Excellent seed parent. Available for late Summer or early Fall shipping.

ROYAL BEAUTY (1 x) - Our first hybrid of distinction. Tall, well branched scape. Flower rose purple (peony red, Pl. 6 J 6) in color, 5" in diameter, nicely formed and recurved. Of excellent texture, strikingly sun resistant. Hardy. Semi-evergreen. A few plants available this Fall.

SHALIMAR (#103) - Height 40". Evergreen foliage. Flower 5". Two-toned centric between salmon and saffron (Pl. 10 C 8). Petals wavy with faint veining, giving darker effect; sepals slightly recurved. Throat jonquil (Pl. 9 J 5). Well branched, floriferous and definitely pink in the garden. Available Spring, 1948.

SUEZ (#92) - Height 42". Evergreen foliage. Flower standing 5", quite recurved, two-toned purple red, off turtle dove (Pl. 55 L 1), darker veining. Throat sulphur yellow (Pl. 10 J 1), shading to primuline yellow (Pl. 10 L 5), star shaped and conspicuous. Good garden plant, better in semi-shade; very effective as accent among yellow group. Available late Summer or Fall.

SUN QUEEN (#56) - Height 30". Evergreen foliage. Deep chrome yellow self. Wide, frilly petals; narrow, twisting sepals. 6" flower. Hint of green in throat. In bloom from mid-April through June, in Florida. Available late Summer or Fall.

SUNSET GLOW (#158) - Height 34". Evergreen foliage. Large, round, well-shaped flower of good substance, 5½". Petals samurai (Pl. 4 H 11) darkened and ruffled at edges with midzone capucine buff (Pl. 9 E 5). Sepals near pheasant (Pl. 4 C 11). Throat golden yellow (Pl. 10 C 7). Garden effect pink. Available late Summer or Fall.

SWEET ALICE (#1031) - Height 34". Foliage semi-evergreen. Flower emberglow (Pl. 3 G 10). Medium sized. Throat golden yellow (Pl. 10 L 7) and very distinct. Faint midrib. Flowers just top foliage mass, are very abundant on a well established plant and in the garden give a rosy effect. Available in limited quantity this Fall.

THE RUBAIYAT (#5 W) - Height 36". Evergreen foliage. Flower 7", chimney red (Pl. 5 L 10). Throat star shaped, daffodil (Pl. 10 J 6). Long season of bloom in Florida and hardy in other sections. Not available until Spring, 1948.

To those who prefer to "grow their own" we offer seed - hand pollinated, gathered from our collection of plants - at \$1.00 per package of 50 seed. They are ripening daily now and in our experience immediate planting has obtained the best percentage of germination.



* By the name of the plant means it is not recommended for Florida gardens.

* By the season of bloom means recurrent in Florida.

Early, from March through April.

Midseason, from May 1 to 31.

Late, blooming after June 1 for the first time.
