Dear Rock Gardener:

The colorful Autumn months with their long cool nights are almost upon us and should be marked, lest they slip by unnoticed. These are important months in the development of perennial plants, the true and loyal friends of all gardeners, for they make new, strong roots and tight mounds of sturdy leaves, getting set to face the rigors of Winter. These months are equally important to rock gardeners, for this is a favorable time to make any rearrangements you may have planned, replacing the things that may have disappeared through the Summer, dividing the large clumps of Campanulas, Phloxes and other fast growers. This is also the time to make arrangements to get new material for filling in and for building up your collection of rare rock plants that you have been yearning to watch grow in your garden.

The never ending search for new material has continued here and we are proud to offer the following noteworthy plants for fall delivery:

SEDUM POPULIFOLIUM. The only hardy shrubby sedum from Siberia. It has upright branches with thick, fleshy, toothed leaves and topped with pale pink flowers in Fall. 75c each.

HEDERA COLCHICA. A very interesting slow climbing vine with sturdy branches and thick, leathery, dark green heart-shaped leaves. Each 50c. 3 for \$1.25. 12 for \$5.00.

LEWISIA HOWELLII. Large attractive rosettes of thick, evergreen leaves and sprays of delicate pink flowers, veined dark red that appear in late June. 50c each. 3 for \$1.25.

TRILLIUM ERECTUM, with dark red flowers; TRILLIUM STYLOSUM, with large clear rose flowers and TRILLIUM UNDULATUM, with white flowers, veined deep red are now available at 35c each.

Besides these new introductions we still have our standard stock listed in our Handbook and Catalogue. The prices are still the same and all are still available with the following few exceptions: Acaena buchananii; Antirrhinum molle; Cymbalaria aequitriloba; Dianthus alpinus; Haberlea rhodopensis; Mentha requinii; Rhododendron impeditum; R. keleticum and R. racemosum. These species are still in stock but we must hold all we have left in order to build up our supply.

We take particular pride in our present crop of Heaths and Heathers. All the varieties have been increased considerably and are now growing beautifully.
