These fine everblooming house plants are very popular and we have made arrangements with two of the best growers in the country to supply us with good plants for our customers. The plants we offer are well established in 2 1-4 inch pots. Some of them will have buds or flowers on them, but not all, however, they will be good and thrifty and with proper care will soon come into bloom. ALL VIOLETS ARE SHIPPED PREPAID.

CULTURE—On arrival, water the plants first. Set the pot in pan of lukewarm water and allow the pot to soak all it can. After two or three weeks re-pot the plants in four inch pots. Keep the plants out of direct sunlight. They like northern or eastern light and a temperature of 60 to 80 degrees. Fertilize with Dixco plant food solution. Dixco concentrated plant food can be had in 4 oz. packages for 35c postpaid. This dissolves quickly in water and four ounces will make six gallons of fine plant food.

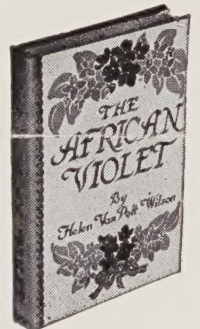

WIK-FED FLOWER POTS

A SCIENTIFIC FLOWER POT THAT HAS EVERYTHING

Plants take on new life when fed the correct amount of water by this method. In "Wik-Fed," a wick of Fiberglass yarn feeds water by capillary attraction from a water holder direct to the roots of the plants. Growers of African Violets maintain sub-irrigation is the most satisfactory watering system for these delicate plants. One filling of the base lasts from 7 to 10 days.

The "Wik-Fed" has two parts—the black base or lower part which holds the water which is fed to the plant by the wick passing through a hole in the pot or upper part. The upper pot is available in several pastel shades—**Ivory, yellow, coral, pink, marble and green**— colors which harmonize any type of decoration.

Both base and pots are designed in rounded, graceful lines of non-breakable and odorless plastic. Pot is 4 inches in diameter and base and pot together measure 5" high. The base of the pot has three small nipples which raise it from the table and the pot sets down into the base about 1-16 of an inch. This eliminates water stains on fine furniture which is so customary with the conventional pot holder.
