

We guarantee all bulbs and bulblets to be free of insects and disease, true to name and full size. We will replace stock or refund purchase price, on any bulbs or bulblets purchased from us that do not meet the above guarantee, but since we have no control over cultural treatment we cannot guarantee the crop, nor do we guarantee bulblets to grow.

Our bulbs are state inspected.

SIZES OF BULBS

Large bulbs are $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter or more, and give the largest spikes of bloom.

Medium bulbs are $\frac{3}{4}$ to $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches in diameter. These make nice large blooms, but not as large as large bulbs.

Small bulbs average $\frac{1}{2}$ inch in diameter and sometimes bloom. They make a nice large bulb for the next year.

Bulblets -- The little hard shelled cormels from which bulbs are grown.

TERMS

Orders are prepaid to all points in U. S. A. No orders for less than \$2.00 will be accepted. Please do not send stamps.

All orders must be accompanied by cash in full, or 25% deposit will hold orders for April delivery, balance to be sent before shipment.

Retail bulb orders cannot be shipped until danger of freezing is past, except by special request. We assume no responsibility on orders shipped before April first.

We reserve the right to refund your money on items that are sold out.

Overcount or extras with all retail orders.

Where a variety is listed at 2 for 20c, etc., please do not order a smaller number at a lower price.

We do not recommend the purchase of bulblets unless you have had experience in growing them. Sometimes they are rather difficult to germinate and they must be kept reasonably moist.

CULTURE

Gladiolus can be grown by most anyone in most any kind of soil that is not too rich. Plant larger size bulbs in beds or rows not less than 6 inches apart for best results. Plant six inches deep in light soil or three inches deep in heavy soil. Cultivate frequently and give plenty of water, if possible, especially when blooming. However, too much water will make weak stems.
