



This is an illustration of the tree as you will receive it in thoroughly dormant condition. It transplants easily bare root. Balling and burlapping is not needed.

The exquisite pink flowers appear just before the leaves and last for weeks.

They are followed by multitudes of bright red berries in the fall which stay on the tree well into the winter.

The ultimate height is 15 to 20 feet. It is always a neat, symetrical, perfectly hardy small tree, very resistant to all insect pests and disease and never gets out of bounds.

All our Pink Dogwood is field budded on the native white Dogwood, Cornus Florida, seedlings especially grown for that purpose and stay 2 years or more in the nursery row in real Dogwood soil. Dogwood really grows here—the woods are full of it. We could collect millions of wild plants and sell them at a ridiculous figure but we don't do that. We wouldn't want to sell that kind of stock and you wouldn't want to buy it.



LOWERING Crabapples are one of the best of all ornamental flowering trees.

Because they are vigorous growers with attractive bark and foliage and an outstanding display of blossoms early in the Spring.

And because they require no petting or pampering. They transplant easily and, due to their vigorous disease and insect free habit, make an immediate show yet never crowd the garden as they remain a low tree under 20 feet quite suited to even the smallest grounds. With this in mind these three varieties are especially recommended.

OPA — Covered with bright red buds bursting into deep pink fragrant flowers followed by lots of tiny red apples in Summer, the leaves are a rich red-bronze.

LEYI — The light red blossoms open from red buds just as the young red leaves begin to unfurl and are followed by red fruit and rich green leaves later in the season.

MIEDZWETSKYANA — A very conspicuous form with purplish leaves and reddish bark and wood. The flowers and fruit are a deep purple-red.


3 YEAR ROOT-

These flowering crabapples are grafted on root-pruned, transplanted, western-grown apple seed-lings and make a straight, strong, unbranched whip the first year. The next Spring these whips are topped at a heighth of 30 inches to make them branch heavily and uniformly during the second year. They are sprayed regularly throughout both growing seasons and grown on a clay loam soil which produces a heavy branched root system assuring your customer of a tree which will transplant unusually well. They are never dug until all foliage has been shed in the Fall and the temperature is low enough to insure well ripened bark.


