# BOTANICAL TULIPS

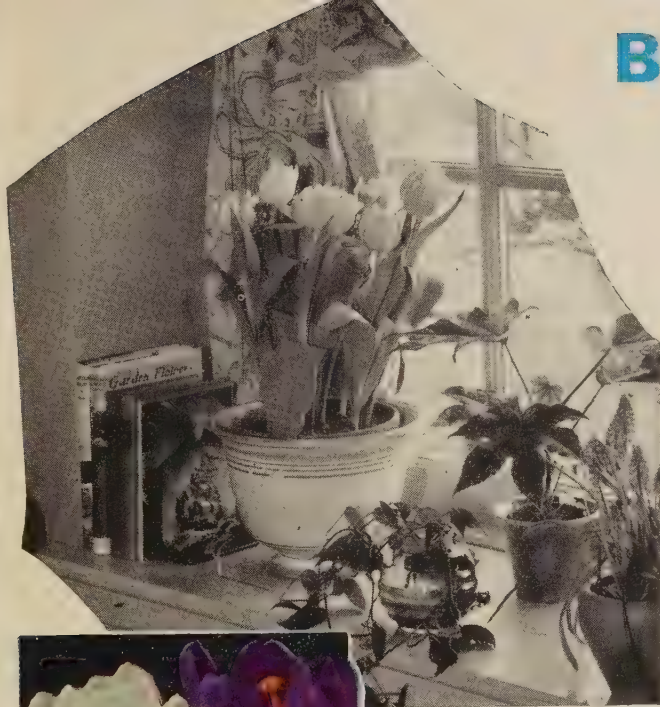
