

We suggest that you plant your bulbs in groups, using only one variety or color to each group, in order to obtain the most pleasing effect.

Dig a hole large enough to accommodate all the bulbs in a group (25, 10 or fewer). Set the bulbs in it, spaced 4 to 5 inches apart, and replace the soil.

There are countless ways of combining different kinds of bulbs to make a beautiful planting. Golden Daffodils and early Tulips are natural companions; Hyacinths and early Tulips, and Scilla Campanulata and Mayflowering Tulips are further suggestions. A ground cover or border of pansies and other early spring flowers makes a nice finishing touch for a Tulip planting. Try new variety and color combinations and see what you can do to create an original garden of your own.
