SIBERIAN IRIS

These iris take more moisture than tall bearded. Shipment will be made in early fall, to permit them to re-establish. Set the plants deeper, and mulch the first winter. Let the clumps grow for four or five years without disturbing. Their blooming season is about the time of the late tall bearded iris, the flowers are smaller, but have great substance, and thus are long lasting in the garden or when cut. We have the majority of the newer Siberians listed, such as China Blue, May Morning, Tonawanda Red Flare, etc., not available for sale until 1951, but will book your order on request for spring shipping.

Our roots are large and good. Stock is limited, so order early. Shipping starts about September 1st. Be sure to plant about four inches deep, and lay a heavy mulch of straw, leaves or peat moss over them each winter. This mulch can be worked in after spring growth starts, and is ideal for soil improvement. We have added wood and coal ashes to heavy clay, also sand to break it up, and top dressed the soil liberally with peat moss, well rotted manure or compost. Spurias are one of the most valuable of flowers for line arrangements or corsage work.

The plants we offer are all one to two-year-old well developed roots that, given care, should bloom the first year. Plant in good garden soil, deeply spaded, finely broken up, using peat moss or composted soil close in about the root. Set with crown two to three inches below soil surface and in a level or raised bed, as poppies will kill or rot out if

crown is in a pocket or depressed area. To mulch over winter, lift the new, green leaves (fall growth) of the poppies, place a crown or collar of straw about the poppy plant, and allow the foliage to fall back. This is preferable to a solid mulch over top of the plant.
