For Cut Flowers

You will find the Siberian and Spuria Iris ideal for cut flowers, for they are easy to get to the flower show in perfect condition, and long lasting as bouquets. Below are a few we grow for this purpose, also other perennials ideally suited for cutting.

SIBERIAN IRIS

Gatineau. Large flowered, clear bright blue **75c**

Caesar's Brother. Rich pansy violet..... **75c**

Snowcrest. Frilled, sparkling white **75c**

These are nice-sized clumps, sure to bloom in 1952. Shipment after Sept. 1st. Plant in full sun or light shade, in the regular perennial border or in a moist location. Plant much deeper than Tall Bearded Iris, and mulch heavily the first winter. Leave clumps undisturbed for four or five years.

SPURIA IRIS

Gold Nugget. Free-blooming bright yellow**\$1.00**

Shelford Giant. Tall, creamy white, with bright yellow signal patch. Likes lots of moisture and very rich soil. An exceedingly fine "corsage flower"**\$1.50**

Our roots are large and good. Stock is limited. Shipment after Sept. 1st.

PYRETHRUM

Pink Beauty. Large deep pink blooms with lighter center **50c**

Miami Queen. Rosy pink, semi-double, long, strong stems, very rapid growing.... **50c**

Victory. Pure white, very double. Grows more slowly than the pink ones **65c**

These plants will be sent in early September, and are good strong ones. Be sure to mulch heavily first winter. Soil should be rich and well drained. These should be divided every two years to prevent formation of "woody centers" which decreases blooming.

We have a few selected single and double Pyrethrum, from our own seedlings, at \$2.00 for six plants. These are mainly light to deep pink, with a few bright red.

PEONIES

When the Peonies are in bloom, we mark the best ones for cut flowers. We have some good seedling Peonies, in light pink, deep pink, white, and red. We

will send you three different ones for \$2.00 or six, all different, for \$3.50. Shipment after Sept. 10th.

OTHER IRIS FOR CUTTING

We have a few Table and Intermediate Iris that often are in bloom for Mother's Day in a good season, and frequently continue up until Decoration Day. Their stems are short and slender, so they make nice bouquets or low table arrangements. We'll select six, all different, for \$1.25. Shipments begin July 10th.

TULIPS AND DAFFODILS

Year after year customers come out, seeking our fresh cut flowers for Mother's Day. Red and white tulips are favorites, as are the large, late blooming daffodils. Of recent times the novel Parrot Tulips have been in great demand. We'll send you 25 Tulips and 25 Daffodils, selected for cutting, for \$4.00, or 100 (50 Tulips and 50 Daffodils) for \$7.50.
