VAHART SMOOTH WHEAT

Va. recommends it for its long record of high yields, stiff straw, and resistance to mildew, cold and loose smut. A selection from Redhart made at V. P. I. it averaged 11.4 bu. per acre more at the Williamsburg experiment station, has taller, stronger straw, larger, plumper heads, more winter resistance and later maturity. Most Vahart is mixed. Ours is carefully field rogued.

Calhoun Barley. W. C. Johnson, King Wm. Co., Va., says: "I will plant no other small grain but Calhoun barley, as it is so much more profitable. It made 75 bu. per acre to 14 for wheat and 50 for oats. It has extra large heavy heads and big plump grain. It has medium short, very stiff straw. Sown 2 bu. per acre Dec. 23, it stood the winter and stooled to a perfect stand. I cut it and sowed soybeans 2 weeks before wheat and oats ripened.

There is no way to detect the difference in the seed of White Dutch Clover and Ladino Clover.

The only Ladino Clover we are offering to our trade was grown in California and Oregon, which seed is produced on virgin land and white clover does not grow naturally in this territory. Consequently, our trade buying Ladino Clover from us can be sure of 100% pure Ladino. Seed produced in the areas east of the Mississippi is somewhat cheaper in price, but when figured on an acreage planting cost basis, the difference in price is exceedingly small and no doubt when your crop is produced the genuine Ladino Clover will show up to much better advantage and give more grazing and hay crop per acre.

The Affidavit Ladino Clover we are offering shows a purity well over 99% and over 90% germinatoin, and in fact, in our opinion, is equal in every respect to Certified Seed. Our Certified Blue Tag Ladino carries official certification tag and is of the very highest quality. New crop Certified Ladino, however, will not be available until the latter part of September or early October, as it requires considerable time to get official tags through and sealed. Our customers can have every confidence in the Affidavit Seed we offer, giving equally as good results as Certified.

Regarding Alfalfa

Information to hand is that the excessive rains throughout Oklahoma and Kansas will delay the seed crop considerably. From present prospects we will hardly have any new crop Oklahoma Alfelfa available until early September, and Kansas seed after the middle of September, which would be too late for our fall planting. We urge our customers to order their requirements early if they intend to plant Alfalfa this fall, as supplies of seed available for spot delivery are exceedingly short in the country today.

For your information, the crop of Crimson Clover harvested in the producing areas of America this year, from best authorities, will only amount to 20% of that produced last year, and as a consequence domestic seed is bringing a very heavy premium over French grown imported seed.

The French grown seed was harvested under most ideal conditions and is beautiful, plump, bright quality, superior to domestic seed. Samples we have so far received are showing a purity of well over 99% and no German Moss whatsoever. We secured our supply of French grown seed from the very best cleaners in France and only purchased the very top quality. We have supplied Crimson Clover in the past from France and it has given equally as good results as domestic seed. We offer now crop Crimson Clover now for immediate and September shipment, at very attractive prices. We believe early purchases of Crimson Clover advisable, for with the shortage of seed available for planting this year, we anticipate a stronger to higher market with an early sell out of seed.


