Lovely medium shade of lavender. Opens up to 7 very large recurved florets on a strong straight spike. Good attachment and placement.

Violet-blue with reddish brown markings. Very tall, upright spikes. Florets are heavy texture, good placement.

Rich, vibrant red with 6-8 florets open on a 20-22 bud spike. Flower-head is 32 inches, with 5½ to 6 inch florets.

RUFFLED NIGHT (Rich 47) 454-70

A black red with clear glowing blooms of satin sheen, florets ruffled, flat open, heavy textured, small white pencil line on lower petals.

SIBONEY (Allen 48) 566-90

A fine rich shade of lavender, opens up to 7 ruffled fluted florets on long flowerheads. Does not fleck.

SUNLIGHT (Spiller 46) 416-87

Rose pink shading to a golden center, giving an overall appearance of a brilliant orange color. Nice large florets which are well placed and firmly attached.

TEXAS (Buchanan 47) 500-70

Large exhibition type white. Opens 7 to 9 well placed 5½ to 6 inch blooms with a 28 to 30 inch flowerhead, carrying 17 to 19 buds.

TEMPTATION (Kadel 49) 470-75

A clear soft rose, lighter in the throat. It opens up to 8 florets of good attachment and placement.

A very pure white color, tiny violet mark deep in throat. Slightly ruffled, well placed and spaced florets on a strong wiry stem.

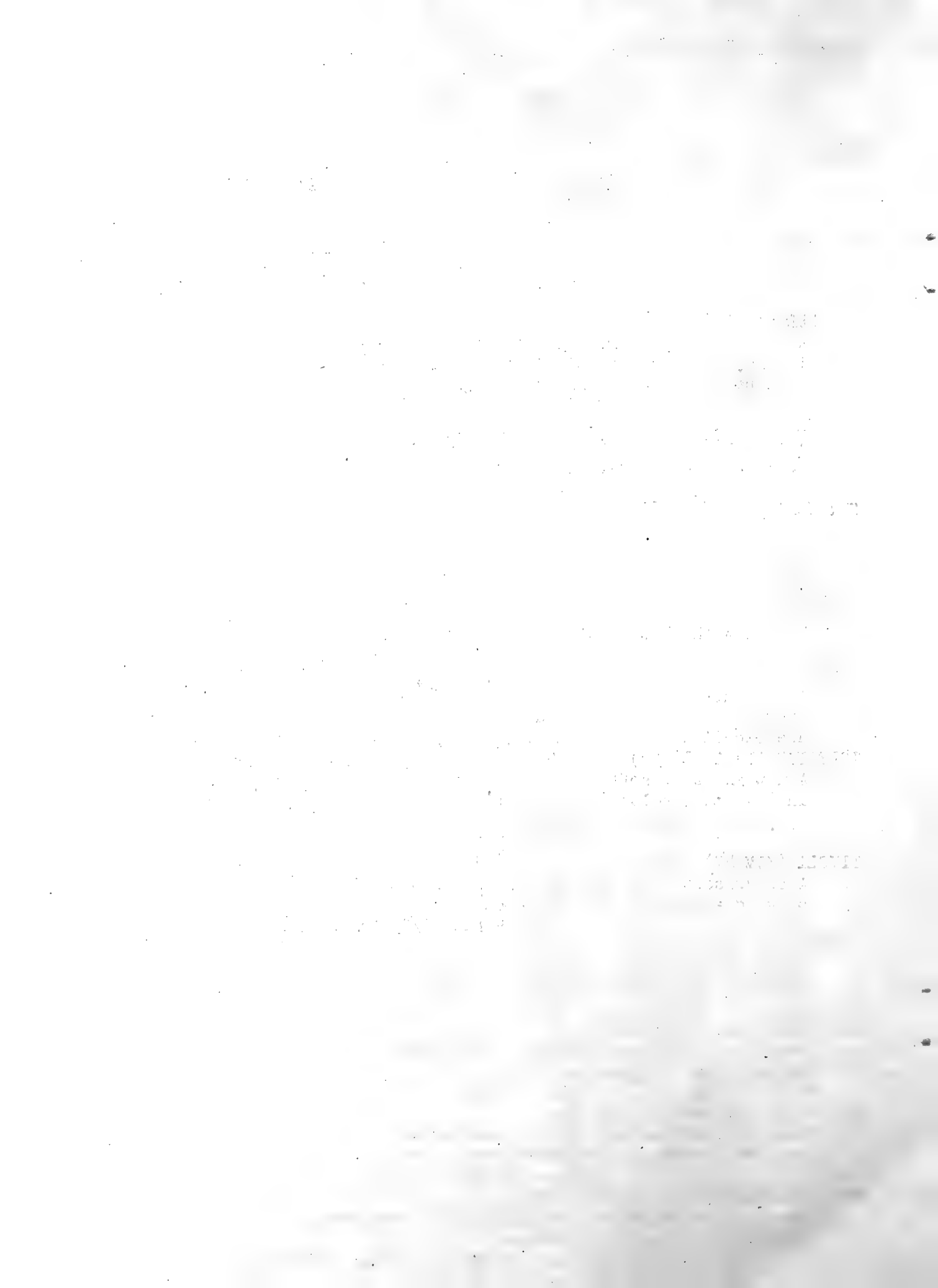
