## TULIPS—How Many Bulbs to Order for Beds of a Specific Size

Below we give the number of bulbs needed to plant a circular bed. Plant outside rows first, placing the bulbs 3 inches from edge of bed. It is advisable to plant the outer rows more closely than those toward the center.

To arrive at the number of bulbs required for an oval bed, add the length and breadth and divide by two, using the result as the diameter in above table. A bed 6 feet wide by 8 feet long will require the same number of bulbs as a round bed 7 feet in diamater. $(6+8=14$; divided by 2 gives 7.)

## PLEASE NOTE

The mere fact that a variety is new does not warrant its inclusion in our catalog, for we never offer novelties of questionable merit. Once a new sort has been proved superior, we are glad to list it. Oftentimes these recent introductions win their way to popularity very quickly and soon take the place of older favorites.

Tulips are undoubtedly the most spectacular of spring bulbs. They bring a blaze of color to the garden just at the time when another day of drab winter seems unendurable. The color range that they cover goes from clear white to deepest purple and maroon, including many marvelous vari-colored combinations. By choosing a good selection of early, midseason and late varieties, Tulips may be enjoyed for the best part of six weeks outdoors, with an additional two months added when suitable sorts are forced indoors.

## CULTURE

Tulips should not be planted where they have been grown for two years previously. They do best in fresh soil or in beds where the soil has been changed. Growing them in the same place for more than two years will lead to failure in the end.

Do not use fresh stable manure at planting time, for it is injurious to the roots. Well-rotted manure will prove beneficial. Bonemeal or dried sheep manure also can be used, about three handfuls to the square yard. This must be thrown on top of the soil before planting.

Nearly all Tulips should be planted outside about 5 inches deep and 6 inches apart, according to the size of the bulb. They should be planted four to six weeks before severe frost sets in . For best results, do not mulch them until after the soil has become frozen, to keep out mice, etc., and do not mulch them too heavily; $1 / 2$ inch will prove quite enough. Old cow manure or peat moss may be used for this purpose.

## DARWIN TULIPS

The chief characteristics of the Darwins are the perfect cupped shape of the flowers, fleshly substantial petals, tall stems, and bright colors ranging through all the shades of pink and red to purple. There are certain slaty blues and blue-violets that might almost be called blue, while the black Tulip is nearly realized in some of the dark maroon varieties. There are comparatively few pure yellow varieties. Most Darwins can be foced by the Middle of February, many of them even earlier, provided that they are potted as soon as received.

The bulbs must be set further apart than is the case with the early Tulips, and plenty of room on the benches must be given when vigorous growth begins. They should be grown slowly under a moderate temperature. Too high a temperature should be avoided, or poor flowers result.

Nearly all varieties, but especially the mauve-colored ones, lose their true color and become much paler when forced.

An asterisk (*) preceding the name indicates that it may be successfully forced. The figure following indicates the relative time of flowering. All varieties of Tulips, Narcissus and Hyacinths are listed in the order of their respective merits, regardless of price. The variety which, in our opinion, is the choicest of its class is listed first, the second best is second, etc.

## BREEDER TULIPS

With the revival of the taste for bronze, brown and buff tones, attention was drawn to these Tulips, which have now become the most popular late Tulips. And they deserve their popularity, not only for their peculiar and odd colors, but also for their geat lasting qualities. In size and height they frequently surpass even the finest Darwins.

## NARCISSUS or DAFFODILS

The terms Narcissus and Daffodil are interchangeable, although there exists a tendency to apply the term Narcissus to the small-flowering groups like Poeticus, Leedsii, Barrii and Incomparabilis, while the larger-flowered Trumpet varieties are most frequently referred to as Daffodils.

Soil and Its Treatment. Narcissus will thrive in any ordinary garden soil but prefer a deep, rather moist, sandy loam. When the soil is of a dry and sandy nature it should be deeply dug, if possible at least a season before planting the bulbs, with composted leaves of well-rotted cow manure added and a vegetable or annual crop grown on the ground. Before the bulbs are planted, a sprinkling of lime should be
spread on the surface and then raked in. It is also beneficial to add bonemeal at the rate of $11 / 2$ ounces to the square yard while digging the soil. Never use fresh manure of any kind at planting time-it burns the roots. On very poor and dry sandy soils we recommerd the addition of about I ounce per square yard of sulphate of potash to be sprinkled over the surface of the ground after planting.

Naturalizing in Grass, etc. All Narcissus will grow equally well in the open or in partial shade. In the flower border, to obtain the best effect they should be planted in large groups of irregular outline, each group or clump to contain one variety only. Avoid straight lines, circles, and symmetrical designs. In the hardy border, masses of Nareissus can be planted between clumps of herbaceous plants, which hide as well as shelter the foliage later in the season.

A special process of curing and precooling shortens the growing period for forcing Daffodils so that they may be brought into flower at least three weeks in advance of the untreated bulbs. The bulbs should be potted immediately on receipt and buried outside with a good mulch to keep out the frost. In from seven to ten weeks, depending on the variety, the flower buds will have become sufficiently advanced that they may be noticed inside the foliage. The bulbs should not be brought into the greenhouse until they have developed to the point where the buds have appeared through the neck of the bulb. In the greenhouse at a temperature of 60 degrees they will bloom in from four to five weeks.

## HYACINTHS

In beds or borders. Hyacinths should be planted 4 inchés deep from the crown of the bulb to the surface of the soil or less, according to size, and about 6 inches apart or more, according to the number of bulbs available for a given space. The soil should be made moderately firm. After planting, the beds must be mulched with litter as a protection against severe weather. All varieties listed are suitable for both forcing and outdoor planting. For outdoor beds or borders, first-size bulbs produce flowers less top-heavy than those from exhibition bulbs.

Culture in pots. The pots for all bulbs should be well drained, the soil made moderately firm, and a little sharp sand dusted under the base of each bulb; then add more soil until one-third of the bulb appears above the surface.

After potting the bulbs, the pans may be plunged into a coldframe or in a sheltered spot in the garden. They should be covered with several inches of soil, and before severe frost sets in, they should be mulched heavily with leaves or straw. They may be lifted after January I, provided the bud is already out of the bulb, Bulbs not sufficiently advanced should be left until developed.

Keep the pans in a dark cool spot until the buds extend sufficiently above the bulb. After the flowers are plainly visible, they should be kept in a slightly cooler temperature to promote sturdy growth of the plants. The flowers should not be exposed to strong sunlight at any time, for they are apt to fade. For indoor culture plant exhibition size bulbs of named varieties only.

Mary of the late-flowering Lily bulbs are not ready before the end of Novem. ber. Where the ground is likely to freeze, we advise the preparation of the Lily beds or borders early in autumn, covering with 4 to 6 inches of leaves or other litter to prevent the ground from freezing until the bulbs arrive. See that they have a well-drained position. Without exception, they prefer a half-shady, moist location, protected against the hot sun. The ground must be thoroughly spaded to a depth of 18 inches before planting Lilies and must be enriched by adding equal portions of leafmold, peat and rotten manure. Plant the bulbs 6 to 8 inches deep. Varieties like Speciosum require at least 8 inches. Put some sand under and around the bulbs to insure proper drainage. Cover the beds with 6 to 8 inches of leaves or other litter, which must be removed in spring.
