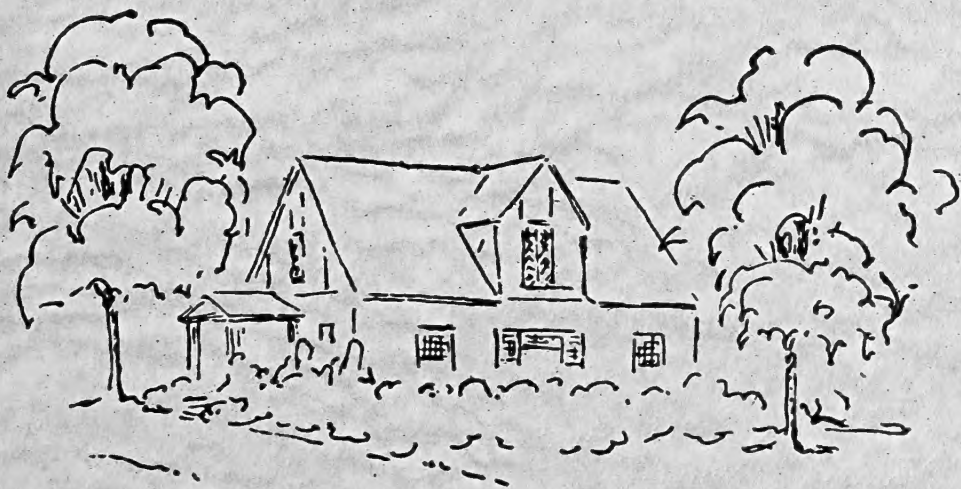

Our guarantee is void on accounts not paid within thirty days after date of invoice.

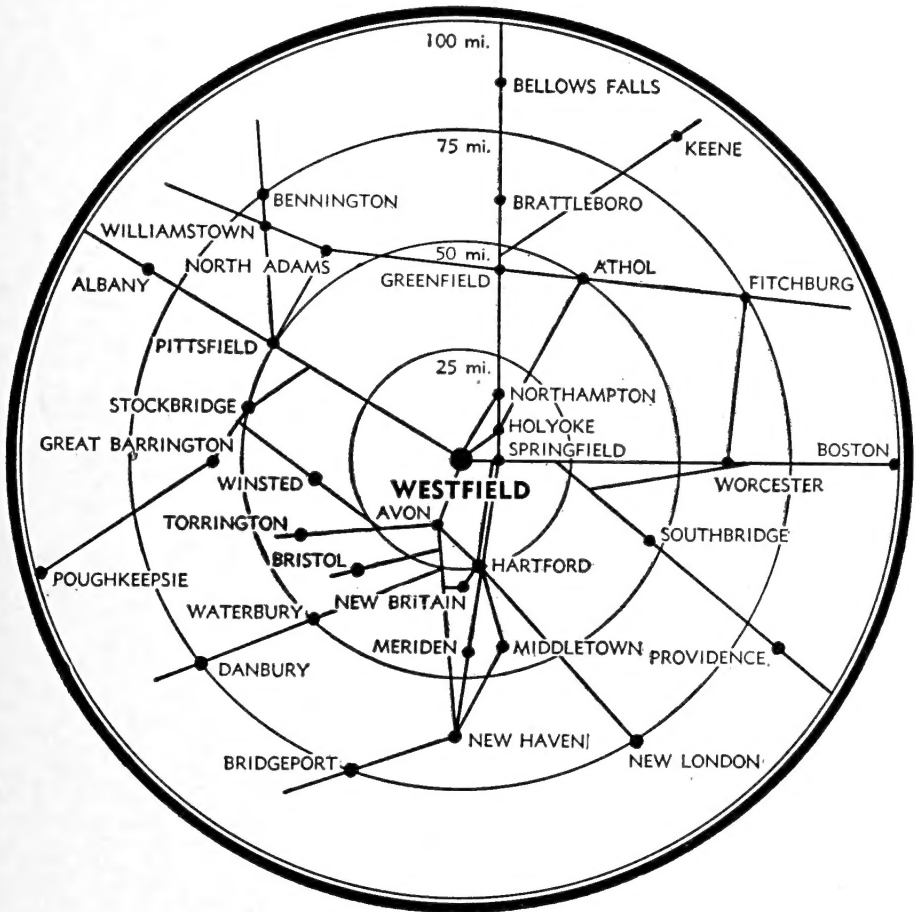

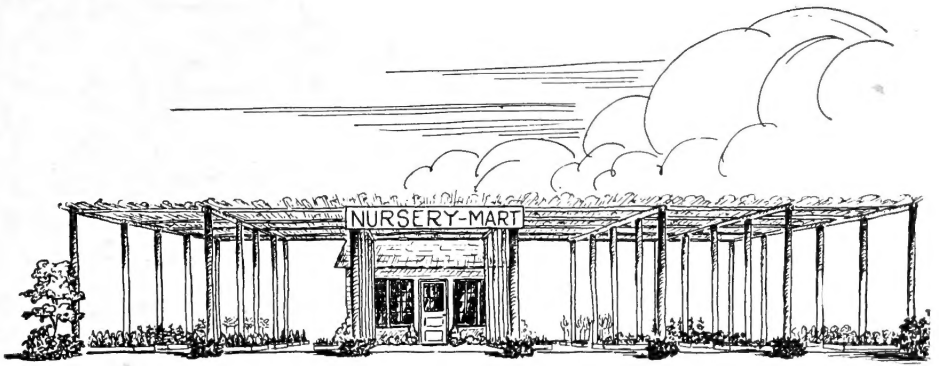


Change in Policy

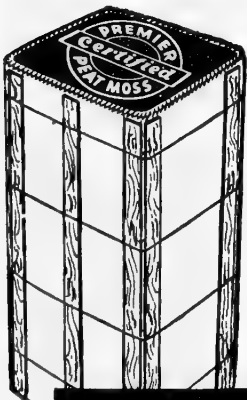

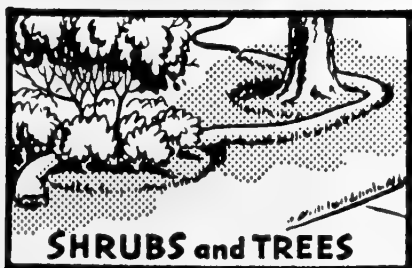

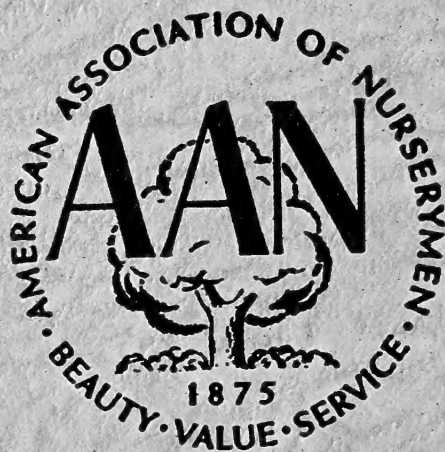
Terms:
